By the KING. PROCLAMATION,

For Encouraging Seamen and Landmen to enter themselves on Board His Majesty's Ships of War.

GEORGE

HEREAS it is Our Royal Intention to give all due Encouragement to all such Seamen and Landmen who shall volunta-Carts, within the Borough of Truto, and Tate of the Adjoining Parishes, in the County of Cornwall.

An All for preferving the Works made for supplying the Town of Bradford, in the County of York, and Part of the Township of Horton, in the Parish of Bradford aforesaid, with Water; for the more easy such as Seamen and Landmen who main voluntarily enter themselves in Our Service; We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation:

And We do hereby promise and declare, That all such Able Seamen, not above the Age of Fifty, not appear to the seamen and Landmen who main voluntarily enter themselves in Our Service; We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation: under the Age of Twenty Years, fit for Our Service, who shall, on or before the Thirtieth Day of June next, voluntarily enter themselves to serve in Our Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Licutenants of Our Ships, or Officers employed in Tenders, or at Rendezvous on Shore, for Raifing Men for the Service of Our Navy, shall receive, as Our Royal Bounty, the Sum of Three Pounds each Man; and all such Ordinary Seamen, sit for Our Service, who shall so enter themselves as afore-said, shall receive the Sum of Two Pounds each Man: And all fuch Able-Bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who shall so enter themselves as aforefaid, shall receive the Sum of Twenty Shillings each Man, as Our Royal Bounty. Such respective Sums to be paid them by the respective Clerks of the Cheque, refiding at the Ports or Places where the Ships, into which they shall be entered, shall be, immediately after the Third Muster of such Seamen and Landmen. And We do declare, that the Qualifications of the Seamen and Landmen, fo entering themselves as aforesaid, shall be certified by the Captain, Master, and Boatswain of the Ship or Vessel where they shall enter. And, for Prevention of any Abuses, by any Persons leaving the Vessels to which they shall belong, and entering themselves on Board any other Our Ships or Vessels, in order to obtain the faid Bounty-Money, We do hereby declare and command, that fuch Seamen and Landmen, belonging to any of Our Ships or Veffels, as shall absent themselves from any of the said Ships or Vessels to which they shall belong, and shall enter themselves on Board any other of Our faid Ships or Vesscls, in order to obtain the said Bounty, shall not only lose the Wages due to them in the Ships or Vessels they shall leave, but also be feverely punished according to their Demerits.

By the KING, PROCLAMATION,

For Recalling and Probibiting Seamen from serving Foreign Princes and States, and for granting Rewards for discovering such Seamen as shall conceal themselves.

GEORGER.

HEREAS We are informed, That great Numbers of Mariners and Seafaring Men, Our natural-born Subjects, are in the Service of divers Foreign Princes and States, to the Prejudice of Our Kingdom; We have therefore thought it necesfary, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation; and do hereby strictly charge and command all Masters of Ships, Pilots, Mariners, Seamen, Shipwrights, and other Seafaring Men whatsoever and wheresoever, (being Our natural-born Subjects) who are in the Pay or Service of any Foreign Prince or State, or do ferve in any Foreign Ship or Vessel, that forthwith they, and every of them, do (according to their known and bounden Duty and Allegiance) withdraw themselves, depart from, and quit such Foreign Services, and return Home to their Native Countries. And farther, We do hereby strictly prohibit and forbid all Masters of Ships, Pilots, Mariners, Scamen, Shipwrgilits, and other Scafaring Men whatfoever, (being Our naaural-born Subjects) from entering, and do charge and command them, and every of them, from henceforth, to forhear to enter themselves into the Pay or Service of any Foreign Prince or State, or to serve in any Foreign Ship or Vessel whatsoever, without Our Special Licence first had and obtained

in that Behaif; to all which We expect due Obe-dience and exact Conformity. And We do hereby publish and declare, that the Offenders to the contrary shall not only incur Our just Displeasure, but be proceeded against for their Contempt according to the utmost Severities of the Law. And We do hereby declare, that if any such Masters of Ships, Pilots, Mariners, Seamen, Shipwrights, or other Seafaring Men, (being Our Subjects) shall be taken in any Foreign Service by the Turks, Algerines, or any others, they shall not be reclaimed by Us as Subjects of Great Britain. And we hereby further promise and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman shall be paid any Perion who shall discover any Seaman or Seamen who may secrete thim or themselves, so that fuch Seaman or Seamen shall be taken for Our faid Service by any of Our Sea Officers employed forraising Men, on or before the Thirtieth Day of June next; the faid Rewards to be paid for any Seaman or Seamen fo discovered and taken in and about London, by the Principal Officers and Commissioners of Our Navy; and at the Out-Ports by the Naval Officers (where there are any;) and (where there are no Naval Officers) by the Collectors of Our Customs, immediately, upon a Certificate being produced to the faid Principal Officers and Commissioners of Our Navy, Naval Officers, or Collectors respectively, by the Person who may make Discovery of any Seaman or Seamen as aforefaid, certifying his Name, and the Name or Names and Number of Seamen procured in confequence of his Discovery; the said Certificate to be given by such Officer as may take fuch Seaman or Seamen for Our Service.


