without Our Special Licence first had and obtained in that Behalf; to all which We expect due Obe-dience and exact Conformity. And We do hereby publish and declare, that the Offenders to the contrary shall not only incur Our just Displeasure, but be proceeded against for their Contempt according to the utmost Severities of the Law. And We do hereby declare, that if any such Masters of Ships, Pilots, Mariners, Seamen, Shipwrights, or other Seafaring Men, (being Our Subjects) shall be taken in any Foreign Service by the Turks, Algerines, or any others, they shall not be reclaimed by Us as Subjects of Great Britain. And we hereby further promise and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman shall be paid any Person who shall discover any Seaman or Seamen who may fecrete him or themselves, so that fuch Seaman or Seamen shall be taken for Our faid Service by any of Our Sea Officers employed for raising Men, on or before the Thirtieth Day of June next; the faid Rewards to be paid for any Seaman or Seamen fo discovered and taken in and about London, by the Principal Officers and Commissioners of Our Navy; and at the Out-Ports by the Naval Officers (where there are any;) and (where there are no Naval Officers) by the Collectors of Our Customs, immediately, upon a Certificate being produced to the faid Principal Officers and Commissioners of Our Navy, Naval Officers, or Collectors respectively, by the Person who may make Discovery of any Seaman or Seamen as aforefaid, certifying his Name, and the Name or Names and Number of Seamen procured in consequence of his Discovery; the said Certificate to be given by such Officer as may take fuch Seaman or Seamen for Our Service.

Count Robert Rosen, Adjutant to his Majesty, arrived in Town Yesterday, with Intelligence that the King, on the 15th Instant, attacked and carried the Posts of Kiernankosky and Suomenieni, in Russian Savolax, took Two Pieces of Brass Cannon, the Enemy's whole Stock of Provisions, Ammunition and Baggage, together with a considerable Booty in Cloathing, Arms, Equipage and Money; and made One Officer (Major Baron Ungern de Sternberg, of Willikalenski's Regiment) and Eighty Privates, Prisoners.
