APROCLAMATION,

For pardoning such Seamen and Marines as have deserted, and shall return into His Majesty's Service on or before the Thirtieth Day of June next.

GEORGE R.

THEREAS We are definous to give all due Encouragement to fuch Seamen as may have -deferted from any of Our Ships fince the First Day of January, One thousand seven hundred and eighty-four, and shall be willing to return to Our Service: We have thought sit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation, and do hereby promife Our most gracious Pardon to all such Deserters as shall repair on Board any of Our Ships or Vessels on or before the Thirtieth Day of June next; and We do hereby further promise Our most gracious Pardon to all such Seamen as, having deserted, are now belonging to some one of Our Ships (in which Ship they are hereby permitted to continue) and do declare that fuch Deferters shall be intitled to receive all Wages that may be due to them in the Ship from which they may have deserted, at the Time of such Defertion. And We do also hereby promise Our most gracious Pardon to all Marines who may have de-ferted from Our Service fince the faid First Day of January, One thousand seven hundred and eightyfour, and shall, on or before the said Thirtieth Day of June next, surrender themselves at the Head-Quarters of the Marines established at Portsmouth, Plymouth or Chatham, or to any Recruiting Party of Our faid Forces: And We do hereby declare, that all Scamen and Marines, so surrendering themfelves as aforefaid, shall be released and discharged from all Profecutions, Imprisonments and Penalties commenced or incurred by reason of such Offence. But We do hereby further declare, that all such Deferters, whether Seamen or Marines, who shall not, on or before the faid Thirtieth Day of June next, surrender themselves on Board one of Our Ships or

Vessels of War, or at the Head-Quarters of the Marines established at Portsmouth, Plymouth or Chatham, or to some Recruiting Party of the said Forces, or who shall hereafter absent themselves from the Ships to which they belong, or from the Marine Quarters, without Leave from their Commanding Officers, shall be tried at a Court Martial, and being sound guilty; shall be deemed unfit Objects of Our Royal Mercy, and shall suffer the Punishment of Death, or such other Punishment as they shall be condemned to suffer by Sentence of the said Court. Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Twenty-first Day of May, One thousand seven hundred and ninety, and in the Thirtieth Year of Our Reign.

We have the Reas it has been represented to the King, That there are at this Time several Deserters from the different Corps in His Majesty's Land Service, who might be induced to return to their Duty by an Offer of His Majesty's gracious Pardon, and that such an Instance of His Royal Clemency would have due Instuence upon their future Behavior; His Majesty is pleased to grant His free Pardon to all Deserters from His Land Forces who shall surrender themselves before the Tenth Day of July next, either to the Regiments to which they belong, or to some other Corps in His Majesty's Service, or to any Recruiting Party in Great Britain or Ireland.

Such Deferters, if able-bodied Men and fit for Service, shall be attested in the Corps to which they furrender, and not be liable to be claimed by any other Corps to which they may formerly have

belonged.

And whereas many of the faid Deferters may have inlifted in other Corps, and are now ferving therein; His Majesty is graciously pleased to extend to such Deferters the Benesit of this Pardon, and to direct, that they shall continue to serve in the Corps wherein they now are, and not be claimed by that in which they formerly served.

And whereas feveral of the faid Deferters have been apprehended, and are now in Gaol or in Regimental Custody; His Majesty is likewise pleased to grant to them His free Pardon, of which they are to have the Benefit upon their Arrival at their respective Regiments, or upon their being inlisted by some other Corps, or Recruiting Party.

Any Soldier who may defert, after these His Majesty's most gracious Intentions are made public, shall not be included in the above Pardon, but be proceeded against with the utmost Severity.


