A PROCLAMATION,

For pardoning fuch Seamen and Marines as have deferted, and shall return into His Majesty's Service on or before the Thirtieth Day of June next.

GEORGE R.

THEREAS We are defirous to give all due Encouragement to fuch Seamen as may have - deferted from any of Our Ships fince the First Day four, and fhall be willing to return to Our Service : We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation, and do hereby promife Our most gracious Pardon to all fuch Deferters as fhall repair on Board any of Our Ships or Veffels on or before the Thirtieth Day of June next; and We do hereby further promise Our most gracious Pardon to all such Seamen as, having deserted, are now belonging to fome one of Our Ships (in which Ship they are hereby permitted to continue) and do declare that fuch Deferters shall be intitled to receive all Wages that may be due to them in the Ship from which they may have deferted, at the Time of fuch Defertion. And We do also hereby promise Our most gracious Pardon to all Marines who may have de-ferted from Our Service fince the faid First Day of January, One thousand feven hundred and eightyfour, and shall, on or before the faid Thirtieth Day of June next, surrender themselves at the Head-Quarters of the Marines established at Portsmouth, Plymouth or Chatham, or to any Recruiting Party of Our faid Forces: And We do hereby declare, that all Seamen and Marines, fo furrendering themfelves as aforefaid, shall be released and discharged from all Profecutions, Imprisonments and Penaltics commenced or incurred by reafon of fuch Offence. But We do hereby further declare, that all fuch Deferters, whether Seamen or Marines, who shall not, on or before the faid Thirtieth Day of June next, furrender themfelves on Board one of Our Ships or

Veffels of War, or at the Head-Quarters of the Marines eftablished at Portsmouth, Plymouth or Chatham, or to fome Recruiting Party of the faid Forces, or who shall hereafter absent themselves from the Ships to which they belong, or from the Marine Quarters, without Leave from their Commanding Officers, shall be tried at a Court Martial, and being found guilty; shall be deemed unfit Objects of Our Royal Mercy, and shall fuffer the Punishment of Death, or such other Punishment as they shall be condemned to fuffer by Sentence of the faid Court. Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Twenty-first Day of May, One thousand feven hundred and ninety, and in the Thirtieth Year of Our Reign.

GOD fave the KING.

WHEREAS it has been reprefented to the King, That there are at this Time feveral Deferters from the different Corps in His Majefty's Land Service, who might be induced to return to their Duty by an Offer of His Majefty's gracious Pardon, and that fuch an Inftance of His Royal Clemency would have due Influence upon their future Behavior; His Majefty is pleafed to grant His free Pardon to all Deferters from His Land Forces who fhall furrender themfelves before the Tenth Day of July next, either to the Regiments to which they belong, or to fome other Corps in His Majefty's Service, or to any Recruiting Party in Great Britain or Ireland.

Such Deferters, if able-bodied Men and fit for Service, fhall be attefted in the Corps to which they forrender, and not be liable to be claimed by any other Corps to which they may formerly have belonged.

And whereas many of the faid Defertors may have inlifted in other Corps, and are now ferving therein; His Majefty is gracioufly pleafed to extend to facin Deferters the Benefit of this Pardon, and to direct, that they shall continue to ferve in the Corps wherein they now are, and not be claimed by that in which they formerly ferved.
