Any Soldier who may desert, after these His Majesty's most gracious Intentions are made public, shall not be included in the above Pardon, but be proceeded against with the utmost Severity.

His Remains have been deposited in one of the Towers of Rabat. His Son Muly el Zezid was this Day proclaimed Emperor, in his Room.
