CHELSEA HOSPITAL.

June 14, 1790.

THESE are, by Order of the Right Honourable my Lords and others, Commissioners for the Affairs of the Royal Hospital at Chelsea, to give Notice, that all Out-Pensioners (as well Letter-Men as others) belonging to the said Hospital, residing in London, or within Twenty-five Miles thereof, are required to appear personally at the Secretary's Office in the said Hospital, and are required also to appear regimentally on the respective Days appointed for them, as are hereafter mentioned; when Attendance will be given from Nine o'Clock in the Morning till Three in the Afternoon, in order to register their Appearances, viz:

Friday the 25th of June, 1790,

The Pensioners from the 1st, 2d, and late 3d and 4th Troops of Horse Guards; 1st and 2d Troops of Horse Grenadier Guards; Royal Horse Guards Blue; 3d, 4th, and 7th Regiments of Horse; 1st, 2d, and 3d Regiments of Dragoon Guards; all the Dragoons, and the British Legion.

Saturday the 26th of June,

The Pensioners from 1st Regiment of Foot Guards.

Monday the 28th of June,

The 2d Regiment of Foot Guards.

Tuesday the 29th of June,

The 3d Regiment of Foot Guards.

Wednesday the 30th of June,

The Pensioners from the 1st of Foot to the 17th Regiment inclusive.

Thursday the 1st of July,

Those from the 18th Regiment of Foot to the 35th inclusive.

Friday the 2d of July,

Those from the 36th Regiment of Foot to the 54th inclusive.

Saturday the 3d of July,

Those from the 55th Regiment of Foot to the 80th inclusive.

Monday the 5th of July,

Those from the 81st Regiment of Foot to the 119th Regiment inclusive.

As also the Pensioners from Lord Strathaven's, Major Waller's, Elford's, and Fish's Corps, the Royal Garrison Battalion, Loyal Irish, Queen's Rangers, Fencibles in Great Britain, Cinque Ports and Lancashire Volunteers, with all the American and other Corps, the Pensioners from the Ten reduced Regiments of Marines, those from the Independent Companies, those from the Militia, and those who have been Inn-Pensioners of Chelsea Hospital, Letter-Men, and Men at Ninepence per Day, with the private Gentlemen who receive Annuities from the late 1st and 2d Troops of Horse Guards.

And that all Out-Pensioners (as well Letter-Men as others) belonging to the said Hospital, who live at a greater Distance than Twenty-five Miles from London, and those in Scotland and Ireland, are hereby required and commanded, that after the 25th of December, and after every succeeding 25th of June and December till further Orders, they forthwith apply themselves to one of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace in the Neighbourhood where they reside, and make the following Affidavit, which the said Magistrate for the County, City, Borough, or Riding, before whom the Pensioner appears, will sign and date, viz.
