The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS the Time limited by His Ma-iefty's Proclamations of the 7th Day of May laft, for granting Bounties for the Encou-raging of Seamen and Landmen to enter themfelves on Board His Majesty's Ships of War, and Rewards for difcovering Seamen who may fecrete themfelves, will expire on the Thirtieth Day of this inftant June : And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the faid Bounties and Rewards should continue to be paid for some Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, That the Time limited by the aforemen-tioned Proclamations for granting the faid Bounties and Rewards he prolonged and extended from the faid Thirtieth Day of this inftant June to the Thirty-first Day of August next inclusive, and that the Bounties and Reswards thereby given and granted be continued to be paid until the faid Thirty-first Day of August : Whereof all Perfons concerned are to stake Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly. Smyrna, May 21:

Intelligence has been received here; that the Ruffian Squadron failed on the 15th Inftant from Zia, leaving behind on the Ifland all the Albanefe Troops, to take Care of the Fortifications; that on the 16th they fell in with the Turkifh Fleet, between the Cape d'Oro and the Island of Andros; that Major Lam-bro, the Russian Commander; began the Action with Nine Vessels against Eighteen of the Turks; that on the 18th the latter were joined by Seven Algerine Xebecs, who, with great Courage, attacked the Russians, killed a great Number of them, funk Two or Three of their Vessels, and obliged Two to run aground on the Island of Andros, where the Russians fet Fire to them, in order that they might not fall into the Hands of the Enemy; that Major Lambro took to his Boat, with all his Officers, and fet Fire to his Frigate; that the Major, who was wounded in the Action, then embarked on a small Vessel of his Squadron, paffed by Micone, where he staid Three Hours, and proceeded afterwards to Cirigo; and that Two other fmall Veffels of the Ruffian Squadron alfo made their Efcape.

The Affidavit drawn according to the above Form, fworn befure, dated and attefted by a Magistrate, is to be put up in a Cover, and sent by the General Post (directed thus) "To the Right Hon. the Paymaster-General, at the Horse Guards, London." And that Counterparts, or Duplicates of the faid Affidavits, are to be referved by the Out-Penfioner's respectively, to be exhibited to fuch Perfons as shall be directed to pay them, that they may be fatisfied that all fuch as may claim Out-Penfions are the real Perfons entitled to receive the fame.

To the End that the faid Commissioners for the Affairs of the Hospital may be fatisfied that they are the fame Perfons who have paffed their Examinations, the Penhoners are hereby fu ther directed, that fuch of them as have ferved in, and been difcharged from, any of the Regiments or Indepen-dent Companies of Invalids, are not to mention in their Affidavits fuch Regiment or Company of In-val ds in which they ferved, but the Regiment, Troop, or Corps of the Army from which they were first discharged, and recommended and received to Chelfea Hofpital.

And as the General Payments in Great Britain and Ireland, at the End of the enfuing Six Months, are chiefly regulated by the Places of Refidence mentioned by the Penfioners, who are muffered at Chellea in Perion, and in the Body of the Affida-vits of fuch as live at a Diffance, it is hereby ordered and directed, that no Pensioner who shall change the Place of his Abode given in at his Muster, or specified in his Affidavit aforesaid, and who may apply for his Penfion, except to the Officers of Excife nearest such Place of Abode, shall receive the fame, unless it appear by the Certificates of respectable Persons, that such Removal was through some unavoidable Necessity, which he or they could not foresee or prevent.

Laftly, It is no ified, that none will be entered upon the Pay Lifts of the faid Hofpital, or be thought entitled to receive any Benefit therefrom, who ihall not act agreeable to these Orders and Directions.
