The KING's. Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

7 HEREAS the Time limited by H's Majesty's Proclamations of the 7th Day of May last, for granting Bounties for the Encou-raging of Seamen and Landmen to enter themfelves on Board His Majefty's Ships of War, and Rewards for difcovering Seamen who may fecrete themfelves; will expire on the Thirtieth Day of this inftant June : And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, that the faid Boun-ties and Rewards should continue to be paid for feme Time longer; His Majefty doth therefore; by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, That the Time limited by the aforementioned Proclamations for granting the faid Bounties and Rewards be prolonged and extended from the faid Thirtieth Day of this inflant June to the Thirty-first Day of August next inclusive, and that the Bounties and Rewards thereby given and granted be continued to be paid until the faid Thirty-first Day of August : Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.
