Whitehall, July 20. A S feveral Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjects of Great Britain, bave from Time to Time gone, into Foreign Countries to exercise their several Callings, contrary to the Laws of these Kingdoms; the follow ing Abstracts of Acts of Parliament of their lase Majesties, King George the First and Second, and of His present Mujesty, for preventing such Practices, are published for the Information of all Persons rubo may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Disobedience to them. - And it will be observed, that fuch Penalties likewife extend to those who are any ways concerned or instrumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of these Kingdoms, or in the Exportation of the Tools and Instruments used by them, as well as to the Artificers or Manufacturers themfelves.

Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27.

IF any Person shall contract with, entice, or solicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brass, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries, out of the King's Dominions, and shall be convicted thereof upon Indictment or Information, in any of the Courts at Westminster, or at the Affizes or Quarter-Seffions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Perfon having been once convicted, shall offend again, . he shall be fined at the Difcretion of the Court, and imprifoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being fuch Arti-

jesty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the faid Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any fuch Foreign Country, exercifing any of the faid Trades, shall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambassador, Minister or Conful of Great Britain, in the Country where fuch Artificers shall be, or be any Person authorised by such Ambassaor, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from henceforth inhabit within this Realm ; fuch Perfons (hall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Adminustrator, or of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Defcent, De-vife or Purchafe; and fhall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c within this Kingdom, to His Majeftv's Ule, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majetty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made upon Oath before any Juitice of Peace that any Perfon is endeavouring to feduce any fuch Artificer, or that any fuch Artificer hath contracted, or is preparing to go out of His Majefty's Dominions, for the Purpoles aforefaid; fuch Juffice may fend his Warrant to bring the Person complained of before him, or before some other Justice; and it it shall appear by the Oath of one Witnefs, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences, fuch Juffice may bind him to appear at the next Affizes or Qua ter Seffions : And if fuch Perfon shall refuse to give Security, the Justice may commit him to Goal till the next Affizes, or Quarter Seffions, and until he fhall he delivered by due Course of Law. And if any fuch Artificer shall be convicted upon Indictment of any fuch Promife, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas for the Purpote aforefaid, he shall give fuch Security to the King, not to depart out of His Majeffy's Dominions, as fuch Court shall think reasonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland, the fame shall be profecuted in the Court of Jufficiary, or the Circuits there.

Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13.

IF any Perfon shall contract with, or endeavour to feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cotton or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland, into any Foreign Country, not within the Dominions of the Crown of dictment or Information in the King's Bench at Westminster, or by Indictment at the Affizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein fuch Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Jufficiary, or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if fuch Offence be committed in Ire-land; the Perfon fo convicted fhall, for every Artificer contracted with, or feduced, forfeit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and shall suffer Impri-fonment in the Common Goal of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Foreiture be paid : And in Cafe of a subsequent Offence of ficers, shall go into any Country but of His Ma. the fame Kind, the Perfons to again offending fhall
