This Day his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant went in State to the House of Peers, and being seated on the Throne with the usual Solemnity, Bryan Connor, Esquire, Deputy Usher of the Black Rod, was sent with a Message from his Excellency to the House of Commons, signifying his Pleasure that they should immediately attend his Excellency in the House of Peers; and the Commons being come thither accordingly, his Excellency gave the Royal Affent

An Act for continuing an Act, paffed in the Thirtieth Year of His present Mujesty, entitled, An Act for the Relief of Persons who have omitted to qualify themselves according to Law.

His Excellency was then pleased to make the following Speech:

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

I HAVE great Satisfaction in communicating to you His Majesty's gracious Acceptance of those Proofs of Attachment, Loyalty and Zeal, which you have manifested in your Proceedings.

Gentlemen of the House of Commons,

His Majesty commands me to refurn you His Thanks for the Means you have afforded Him to provide for the extraordinary Expenses, of Government, that may be necessary at this important Crisis.

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

I am happy at this Season of the Year to relieve you from Attendance in Parliament. I have no Doubt of your Continuance in that Disposition to
