The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS His Majefty, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 7th Day of May laft; was gracioufly pleafed to promife and declare, that all Able bodied Seamen, promite and deciate, that an Able bound Seamen, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, fit for His Majefty's Service, who fhould, on or before the 30th Day of June then next, enter themfelves to ferve in His Majefty's Royal Navy, fhould receive, as His Majefty's Royal Bounty, the Sum of Three Pounds each Man; and that all fuch Ordinary Seamen, as should fo enter themfelves as aforefaid, should receive the Sum of Two Pounds each Man; and that all fuch Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, as fhould fo enter themfelves as aforefaid, should receive the Sum of Twenty Shillings; fuch feveral Sums to be paid to them by the Clerks of the Cheque refiding at the Ports or Places where the Ships, into which fuch Seamen or Land-men fo entering, should be, according to the Certificates therein mentioned : And whereas by another Proclamation bearing Date the faid 7th Day of May, His Majefty was further pleafed to promife and de-clare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Scaman should be paid to any Perfon who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who should fecrete him or themselves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen flould be taken for His Majefty's Service by any of the Sea Officers employed for

A T the Court at St. James's, the 4th of August; raising Men on or before the said 30th Day of June then next; fuch Rewards to be paid for any Seaman or Seamen fo difcovered and taken by the Perfons mentioned in the faid Proclamation, and Perfons mentioned in the faid Proclamation, and according to the Certificate thereby required: And whereas His Majefty, by Order in Council, bearing Date the 23d of June laft, was further pleafed to direct, that the Time limited by the faid Proclamation for granting the faid Bounties and Rewards fhould be prolonged and extended from the faid 30th Day of June to the 31ft of this prefent Month of August, inclusive: And whereas Provision hath been made in the Kingdom of Ireland for the Extraordinary Expence of Government, which may be neceffary in putting and maintaining that Kingbe neceffary in putting and maintaining that King-dom in a State of Defence, and towards raifing Men for His Majefty's Fleet:

His Majefty having this Day taken the faid Proclamations and Order in Council into Confideration, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to declare, that the faid feveral Bounties and Rewards, thereby promifed and declared to be payable during the Times therein respectively mentioned; shall henceforth cease and dete mine, and be no longer paid and payable in this Kingdom, to fuch Able or Ordinary Seamen, or to fuch Able-bodied Landmen as shall henceforth enter themselves in the Kingdom of Ireland to ferve in His Majesty's Navy, or to fuch Perfons who may discover any Seaman or Seamen who shall secrete him or themselves in that Kingdom, from and after the Date hereof, any Thing in the aforelaid Proclamations or Order in Council to the contrary in any wife notwithstanding.
