A^T the Court at St. James's, the 27th of August, 1790,

PRESENT,

The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council. HEREAS an Act of Parliament was passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of the Reign of His late Majefty King George the Second, intituled, "An Act to impower His "Majefty to prohibit the Exportation of Salt Petre, "and to enforce the Law for impowering His Ma-"jefty to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, "or any Sort of Arms and Ammunition; and alfo "to impower His Majefty to reftrain the carry-"ing Coaftwife of Salt Petre, Gunpowder, or "any Sort of Arms or Ammunition;" whereby it is declared and enacted, that His Majefty may, by Proclamation or Order in Council, prohibit the exporting or the attempting to export Salt Petre out of this Kingdom, in fuch Manner and under fuch Reftraints as He fhall think fit; His Majefty judging it neceflary for the prefent to prohibit the Exportation of Salt Petre out of this Kingdom, excepting to the Kingdom of Ireland, doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, that no Perfon or Perfons do, at any Time until further Order, transport out of this Kingdom, nor attempt to transport, nor be aiding or alfitting in transporting any Salt Petre, excepting to the Kingdom of Ireland, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majefty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring or fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by the aforementioned Adt: And His Majefty doth hereby further order, that upon the Exportation of any Salt Petre to the Kingdom of Ire-

land, the Exporter shall enter into a Bond, with Two fufficient Sureties to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successfors, in double the Value of the Salt Petre fo to be exported, for the landing of such Salt Petre in fome Port in Ireland, which shall be expressed under the Hands and Seals of the Collector, Comptroller, or other principal Officer of the Customs at the Port where fuch Salt Petre shall be landed; testifying the landing thereof, such Bond fo entered into as aforefaid shall be delivered up; and that the Condition of such Bond shall be, to produce such Certificate as aforefaid in Six Months from the Date thereof, (the Danger of Seas and Enemies excepted;) and in case no such Certificate shall be produced within Six Months as aforefaid, that the Commissioners of the Customs shall cause fuch Bonds respectively to be put in Suit, unless they shall find fufficient Caule to forbear the same. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasfury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.
