RESENT,

The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council. HEREAS an Aft of Parliament was paffed in the Twenty-ninth Year of the Reign of His late Majefty King George the Second, intituled, "An Aft to impower His "Majefty to prohibit the Exportation of Salt Petre, and to enforce the Law for impowering His Majefty to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms and Ammunition; and alfo to impower His Majefty to reitrain the carry-"ing Coaftwife of Salt Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition;" whereby it is declared and enafted, that His Majefty may, by Proclamation or Order in Council, prohibit the exporting or the attempting to export Salt Petre out of this Kingdom, in fuch Manner and under fuch Reitraints as He fhall think fit; His Majefty judging it neceffary for the prefent to prohibit the Exportation of Salt Petre, out of this Kingdom, excepting to the Kingdom of Ireland, doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, that no Perfon or Perfons do, at any Time until further Order, tranfport out of this Kingdom, nor attempt to tranfport, nor be aiding or ailifting in tranfporting any Salt Petre, excepting to the Kingdom of Ireland, without Leave or Permiffion in that Behalf firft obtained from His Majefty or His Privy Conncil, upon Pain of incurring or fuffering the refpective.Forfeitures and Penalti s inflicted by the aforementioned Act: And His Majefty doth hereby further order, that upon the Exportation of any Salt Petre to the Kingdom of Ire-

and, the Exporter thall enter into a Bond, with Two fufficient Sureties to His Majefty, His Heirs and Succeffors, in double the Value of the Salt Petre fo to be exported, for the landing of fuch Salt Petre in fome Port in Ireland, which fhall be expressed under the Hands and Seals of the Collector, Comptroller, or other principal Officer of the Customs at the Port where fuch Salt Petre shall be landed, testifying the landing thereof, fuch Bond is entered into as aforefaid shall be delivered up; and that the Condition of fuch Bond shall be, to produce fuch Cert ficate as aforefaid in Six Months from the Date thereof, (the Danger of Seas and Enemies excepted;) and in cafe no fuch Certificate shall be produced within Six Months as aforefaid, that the Commissioners of the Customs shall cause fuch Bonds respectively to be put in Suit, unlefs they shall find fufficient Cause to forhear the fame. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majestry's Treafury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

The KING's Molt Excellent Majefty in Council. W HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Proclamations of the 7th Day of May laft for granting Bounties for the encouraging of Seamen and Landmen to enter themfelves on Board His Majefty's Ships of War, and Rewards for discovering Seamen who may fecreic therafilves, was, by His Majefty's Order in Council of the 23d

of June last, prolonged and extended to the 31st of this inftant August : And whereas by another Order in Council, bearing Date the 4th of this present Month of August, His Majesty was pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to declare that the faid Bounties and Rewards should thenceforth cease and determine, and be no longer paid and payable in this Kingdom, to fuch Able or Ordinary Seamen, or to fuch Able-bodied Landmen as should enter themselves in the Kingdom of Ireland to ferve in His Majesty's Navy, or to such Persons who might discover any Seaman or Seamen who should fecrete him or themselves in that Kingdom, from and after the Date of the faid Order : And whereas it is expedient for His Majefty's Service, that the Bounties granted to Able and Ordinary Seamen and Able-bodied Landmen entering themfelves in the Kingdom of Great Britain, and the Rewards to Perfons difcovering Seamen who fecrete themfelves in this Kingdom, fhould continue to be paid for fome Time longer : His Majefty doth therefore, by the Advice of His Privy Coun-cil, hereby order, That the Time limited for the Payment of fuch Bounties and Rewards be prolonged and extended from the faid 31ft of this in-fant August to the 31st Day of October next in-clusive: Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.
