HE King has been pleased to present the Reverend ——— French to the Church and Parish of Kilbride, in the Presbytery of Hamilton and Shire of Lanerk, vacant by the Death of the Reverend David Connell.

Whitehall, September 14.

The King has been pleafed to grant to James Colthirst Bulcock, of Surry-street, in the Parish of St. Clement Danes, in the County of Middlesex, and his Issue, His Royal Licence and Authority to use the Surname of Colthirst only; and also to order that this His Majesty's Concession and Declaration be registered in His College of Arms.

" as a number of us have swore to do your busness;

" 31ft August." Superscribed, "Mr. Tindell, " quen Street."

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bring-ing to Justice the Persons concerned in writing and sending the Letter above mentioned; is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person who actually wrote the said Letter) who shall discover his or her Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
