Her Imperial Majefty, accompanied by their Imperial Highnesses the Great Duke and Dutchess, and the Great Dukes Alexander and Constantine, arrived in Town Yesterday Morning at Ten o'Clock, in order to affist at a Te Deum, celebrated on Account of the Peace with Sweden. This Ceremony, and the Proclamation in different Parts of the City, was attended with extraordinary Pomp, and in the Evening there was an Illumination.
