N Tuefday Night last the Body of his late Royal Highnels, Prince Henry Frederick Duke of Cumberland and Strathern, was privately interred in the Royal Vault in King Henry the Seventh's Chapel at Westminster, having been conveyed to the Prince's Chamber the Night "hefore.

About Nine o'Clock the Proceffion began to move, paffing through the Old Palace Yard to the South-Eaft Door of Weltminister Abbey, upon a Floor railed in, covered with Black Cloth, under an Awning, and lined on each Side with a Party of the Foot Guards, in the following Order:

Jounding a folemn March; the Coverings of the Drums and the Banners of the Trumpets adorned with Naval Trophies.



N. B. Peets, Peers Sons, and Privy Councillors, were likewife called over, and fome attended.

At the Entrance of Westminster Abbey, within the Church, the Dean and Prebendaries, attended by the Choir, received the Body, falling into the Procession just before the Officer of Arms who conducted the Lord Chamberlain, and to proceeded into King Henry the Seventh's Chapel, where the Body was deposited on Treffels, the Head towards the Altar, the Coronet and Cushion being laid upon the Cossin, and the Canopy held over it, while the Service was read by the Dean of Westminster; the Chief Mourner and his Two Supporters fitting on Chairs at the Head of the Corpfe, the Lords Assistants and Supporters of the Pall on Stools on either Side.

The Part of the Service before the Interment being read, the Corpfe was deposited in the Vault; and the Dean having finished the Burial Service, Garter proclaimed his Royal Highnes's Stile as follows:

Thus it hath pleafed Almighty God to take out of this transitory Life unto His Divine Mercy, the late Moft High, Moft Mighty and Illustricus Prince HENRY FREDERICK, Duke of Cumberland and Strathern, Earl of Dublia, Knight of the Moft Noble Order of the Garter, fourth Son of the late Most Illustricus Prince FREDERICK, Prince of Wales, deceased, and third Brother to His Most Excellent Majesty GEORGE the Third, by the Grace of God King of Great Britain, France and Ireland, Defender of the Faith ; whom God blefs and preferve with long Life, Health and Honour, and all Workdly Happines. The Order of Danie-brog was conferred on the Counts Frederick, Revontlau, and Baudiffin; the Generals Wegner, Gol z, Bülard, Castenchiold and Wachnitz, and on Mess. Buchvalt, Urne, Seckendorff, Moltke and Wæchter.
