Vienna, September 18:

THE Public Entry of the Neapolitan Ambassador took Place Yesterday; and this Morning his Excellency made the Demand of the third Archduchess, in Marriage, with the Prince Royal of Naples. That Princess has, in consequence, made a formal Renunciation of all Right of Succession to any of the Possessions of the House of Austria. The two Marriages of the eldest Archdukes will be solemnized Tomorrow.

The King and Queen of Hungary, with the three youngest Archdukes, will set out for Francfort on the 23d; and their Sicilian Majesties, with the two new-married Couples, on the 24th Instant.
