Warsaw, September 24.

Monsieur de Bulgakow, late Minister at Constantinople from Russia, arrived here about Ten Days ago, and on Saturday last had his Audience of His Polish Majesty, and presented to him his Credentials in Quality of Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from that Court.

Vienna, September 25.

The Russian Ambassador received on Friday last, from Bender, the News of a considerable Advantage gained by the Russian Fleet over that of the Captain Pachaw in the Black Sea. The Engagement began on the 28th Ultimo, between the Island of Tendros and Codgia Bay. The Turkish Admiral's Ship, the Capitania of 74 Guns, was blown up, another of 66 Guns, containing 600 Men, and a third Vessel containing 200 Men, were taken by the Russians. Besides which the Whole of the Turkish Fleet was very much damaged, and entirely dispersed. The Loss of the Russians did not exceed Twelve Men.

Hague, October 8.

The Hereditary Prince of Brunswick arrived here on the 6th Instant, and Yesterday had a Levée at the Prince Stadhouder's Palace, where his Serene Highness received the Compliments of the several Members of the Corps Diplomatique, and of the States General, and of many other Persons of Distinction, assembled from the different Provinces of the Republic to attend the Public Fêtes and Ceremonies, which are to take Place in a few Days:

WE, His Majesty's Commissioners for managing the Stamp Duties, duly authorized by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, pursuant to an Act of Parliament, to lett to Farm the Duties granted by An Act of the 25th of His present Majesty on Horses lett to Hire for travelling Post and by Time, do hereby give Notice, that we intend to lett, at our Office in Somerset-Place, the said Duties to Farm on Saturday the 23d of October next, between the Hours of Eleven and Twelve in the Forenoon, within the Two following Districts, and to put the same up at the Sums placed opposite to each (being the gross Amount of the Duties collected therein for the Year ending on the 1st of August, 1787,) for the respective Terms undermentioned, to such Persons as shall be willing to contract for the same. All Persons proposing to bid for the said Duties within these Two Districts, are, at least Three Days previous to the said 23d of October, to signify their Names, Places of Abode, and the District for which they intend to bid, by Letter, directed to us at our Office aforesaid. No Person licensed to lett Horses for the Purpose of travelling Post, nor any Persons for his Use, can be a Contractor for the said Duties.
