Shillings per Quarter, it fhall not be lawful to import Into any Port of this Kingdem, at the End of Six Days after fuch Publication in the London Gazette, any Foreign Rye, or Rye-Meal, at the low Duties: And if it thall arpear, at any Time before the faid 28th Day of February, 1791, by the Average Price of Britifh Beans, as the fame fhall be publifhed in the London Gazette, in the Manner before mentioned, that the Average Price of fuch Beans is under Thirty-two.Shillings per Quarter, it fhall not be lawful to import into any Port of this Kingdom, at the End of Six Days after fuch Publication in the London Gazette any Foreign Beans at the low Duties: And if it:fhall appear, at any Time before the faid Twenty-eighth Day of. February, 1791, by the Average Price of Britifh Barley, as the fame thall be publifhed in the London Gazette in Manner before mentioned, that the Average Price of fuch Barley is under Twenty-four Shillings per Quarter, it hall not be lawful to import into any Port of this Kingdom, at the End of Six Days after fuch Publication in the London Gazette, any Foreign Barley, or Barley-Meal, at the low Duties: And if it fhall appear, at any Time before the faid 28th Day of February, 1791, by the Average Price of Britifh Oats, as the fame fhall be publifhed in the London Gazette, in Manner before mentioned, that the Average Price of fuch Oats is under Sixteen Shillings per Quarter, it fhall not be lawful to import into any Port of this Kingdom, at the End of Six Days after fuch Publication in the London Gazette any Foreign Oats, or Oat-Meal, at the low Duties: And this Order ftall continue in Force until the 28th Day of February, 1791, julefs His Majefty fhall think fit, with the Advice aforefaid, to revoke the fame in Whole or in Part. And it is hereby further ordered and declared, that whenever any of the Articles of Corn or Grain before mentioned refpectively, fhall no longer be importable upon Payment of the low Duties, by Virtue of this Order, bothing herein contained is intended to prevent the Importation of Wheat, Wheat Flour, Rye, Beans, Barley and Oats refpectively, for the Purpofe of being warehoufed, without Payment of Duty, into the Ports of this Kingdom, mentioned in an Act paffed in the Thirteenth Year of His Majelty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to is regulate the Importation and Exportation of "Corn," or into any other of the Ports mentioned in any fubfequent Aft now in Force, as Ports into which Corn may be fo imported, but that the fame may refpectively, whenever the fame refpectively fhall not, by Virtue of this Order, be importable on Payment of the low - Duties, be imported in Conformity to the faid Act of the Thirteenth Year of His Majefty's Reign, and be landed, lodged and fecured in Warehoufes, without Payment of Duty, and may again be delivered out of the fame, fubject to fuch and the like Securities, Regulations, Reftrictioss and Conditions, as are fpecified and provided with refpect to the landing, lodging and fecuring in Warethoufes; and delivering out of Corn or Flour fo imported, without Payment of Duty, by the faid Act paffed in the Thirteenth Year of His prefent Majelty's Reign, or any fubfequent Act; any Thing in this Order notwith!anding.

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury are to give the neceffary Directions herefraccordingly.
