WHEREAS by virtue of an A&, passed in the last Session of Parliament, instituted, "An Act to continue the Laws now in Force for "regulating the Trade between the Subjects of "His Majefty's Deminions and the Inhabitants of " the Territories belonging to the United States of "America, fo far as the same relate to the Trade * and Commerce carried on between this King-" dom and the Inhabitants of the Countries be-" longing to the faid United States," His Majefty, by the Advice of His Privy Council, did, by an Order in Council made on the 1st Day of April, 1790, amongst other Things, declare, That any unmanufactured Goods and Merchandizes, the Importation of which into this Kingdom is not pro-hibited by Law, (except Fifh-Oil, Blubber, Whale-Fins and Spermaceti) and any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Pitch, Tar, Turpentine, Bolin, Bot-Alh, Pearl-Alh, Indigo, Malts, Yards and Bowsprits, being the Growth or Production of any of the Territories of the United States of America, and no other Goods or Merchandizes, might (until further Order) be imported directly from thence into any of the Ports of this Kingdom, either in British-built Ships, owned by His Majefty's Subjects and navigated ac-cording to Law, or in Ships built in the Countries belonging to the United States of America, or any of them, and owned by the Subjects of the faid

or might be fubject and liable to if imported in British-built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subject ; and navigated according to Law, from any British Island or Plantation in America; notwithstanding fuch Goods or Merchandize, or the Ships in which the fame may be brought, might not be accompa-nied with the Certificates or other Documents heretofore required by Law.

And whereas Doubts have arifen upon the true Intent and Meaning of that Part of His Majefly's Order in Council herein before mentioned which respects the Importation of Fish-Oil, Blubber, Whale-Fins and Spermaceti, and fuch other Goods and Merchandize, being of the Growth, Produc-tion or Manufacture of the faid United States, as are not therein enumerated or defcribed; His Majefty, by the Advice of His Council, doth hereby order and declare, That Oil made from Fifh or Creatures living in the Sea, and Blubber, Whale-Fins and Spermaceii, and also all other Goods and Merchandize, the Importation of which into this Kingdom is not prohibited by Law, being the Growth, Production or Manufacture of any of the Territories of the faid United States of America, and not enumerated or defcribed in the faid Order, may be imported from thence into this Kingdom in British or American Ships, owned and navigated as by the faid Order is required, upon Payment of fuch Duties of Customs and Excise as are payable on the like Goods or Merchandize upon their Importation into this Kingdom from Countries not under the Dominion of His Majefty, according to the Tables, marked A. D. and F. annexed to an of them, and owned by the calification tail in a labels, marked A. D. and F. annexed to an United States, or any of them, and whereof the Mafter and Three-Fourth's of the Mariners at leaft are Subjects of the faid United States, or any of them, and may be entered and landed in any Port of this Kingdom, upon Payment of the fame Du-sies as the like Sorts of Goods or Merchandize are "the other Duties composing the Publick Re-"'vonue ;

· · venue ; for permitting the Impartation of centain Goods, Wares and Merchandize, the Produce or Goods, wares and Merchandize, Mc Reduce of Manufacture of the European Dominions of the
 French King, into this Kingdom; and for ap plying certain unclaimed Monies remaining in the

 so the Reduction of the National Dept; or by any other Laws in Forge, paffed fubfequent to the faid Act, for that Purpole; and in Cafes where - different Duties are therein imposed upon the like . Goods imported from different Countries not under the Dominion of His Majefty, then upon the Pay-ment of the loweft of fuch Duties; and fuch Goods and Merchandize shall be entitled to the fame Drawbacks as are allowed upon the Exportation of the Like Goods and Merchandizer from this Kingdom, according to the before-mentioned Tables, or by any other Laws in Force, paffed fublequent to the faid Act, for that Purpole and fhall be liable to the fame Rules, Regulations and Reftrictions as the Dike Goods and Merchandize are hable to upon Im-

portation into any Port of this Kingdom, by any Laws in Force for that Purpole. And the Right Honorable the Lords Commif-

Te Deum was performed both at the Morning and Evening Service, and a Hundred Pieces of Cannon were dicharged from the Ramparts.

Tuefday the reth Instant, being the Day of the Affiance of the Princels Frederica Louis Wilhel-mina of Orange with the Hereditary Prince of Brunswick, a Deputation from the States General folemnly congratulated their Highnefles and all the Stadtholderian Family upon the Occasion; and pre-fented, at the fame Time, to the Princels, a magnificent Prefent of Jewels from their High Mightineffes, as a Mark of their Refpect and Attachment. On the 14th Inflant the Marriage was celebrated in the Great Church of this Reflective with the greateft Magnificence, and their Highmeffes were attended by a very numerous and splendid Procession.
