 “Goods, Wares and Merchandize, the Produce or
 “Manufacture of the European Dominions of the
 “French King, into this Kingdom; and for ap-
 “plying certain unclaimed Monies remaining in the
 “Exchequer for the Payment of Annuities on Lives
 “to the Reduction of the National Debt;” or by
 any other Laws in Force, passed subsequent to the
 said Act, for that Purpose; and in Cases where
 different Duties are therein imposed upon the like
 Goods imported from different Countries not under
 the Dominion of His Majesty, than upon the Pay-
 ment of the lowest of such Duties; and such Goods
 and Merchandize shall be entitled to the same Draw-
 backs as are allowed upon the Exportation of the
 like Goods and Merchandize from this Kingdom,
 according to the before-mentioned Tables, or by
 any other Laws in Force, passed subsequent to the
 said Act, for that Purpose; and shall be liable to
 the same Rules, Regulations and Restrictions as the
 like Goods and Merchandize are liable to upon Im-
 portation into any Port of this Kingdom, by any
 Laws in Force for that Purpose.

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commis-
 sioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords
 Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the
 necessary Directions herein, as to them may respec-
 tively appertain.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Ma-
 jesty's Proclamation of the 7th Day of
 May last, for granting Bounties for the encouraging
 of Seamen and Landmen to enter themselves on
 Board His Majesty's Ships of War, was, so far as
 respects the Bounties granted to Able and Ordinary
 Seamen, and Able-bodied Landmen, entering them-
 selves in the Kingdom of Great Britain, and the
 Rewards to Persons discovering Seamen who might
 secrete themselves in this Kingdom, prolonged and
 extended, by His Majesty's Order in Council of the
 27th of August last, until the 31st Day of this instant
 October: And whereas it is expedient for His
 Majesty's Service, that the said Bounties and Re-
 wards should continue to be paid for some Time
 longer; His Majesty doth therefore, by the Advice
 of His Privy Council, hereby order, That the Pay-
 ment of such Bounties to Able and Ordinary Sea-
 men entering themselves in the Kingdom of Great
 Britain, to serve in His Majesty's Fleet, and also
 the Rewards to Persons discovering Seamen who
 secrete themselves in this Kingdom, be continued
 to the 31st Day of December next inclusive:—
 Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice,
 and govern themselves accordingly.
