The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Time limited by His Ma-W jesty's Proclamation of the 7th Day of May last, for granting Bounties for the encouraging of Seamen and Landmen to enter themfelves on Board His Majefty's Ships of War, was, fo far as respects the Bounties granted to Able and Ordinary Seamen, and Able-bodied Landmen, entering them-felves in the Kingdom of Great Britain, and the Rewards to Perfons discovering Seamen who might fecrete themfelves in this Kingdom, prolonged and extended, by His Majefty's Order in Council of the 27th of August last, until the 31st Day of this instant October : And whereas it is expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the faid Bounties and Rewards should continue to be paid for some Time longer ; His Majefty doth therefore, by the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, 'That the Payment of fuch Bounties to Able and Ordinary Seamen and Able-bodied Landmen entering themselves in the Kingdom of Great Britain, to serve in His Majesty's Fleet, and also the Rewards to Perfons discovering Seamen who fecrete themfelves in this Kingdom, be continued to the 31ft Day of December next inclufive :---Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

Yesterday being the Anniversary of His Majesty's happy Acceffion to the Throne, at Noon the Great Gans at the Salate Battery in His Majefty's Park the

In the Evening a Play was given by Order of his Excellency the Lord Licutenant for the Entertainment of the Ladies; and at Night there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy.

Madrid, October 18.

Advices have been received here, fince those of the 14th Instant, containing further Particulars of the terrible Calamities produced by the Earthquake, which happened at Oran in the Night of the 8th Inthant. By thefe it appears that Twenty incceffive Shocks were felt at flort Intervals. The whole City is deftroyed, and a great Part of the Inhabitants and of the Garrison are buried under the Ruins. Almost all the Forts which cover that Place and it's Diffrict are open or deflroyed, so as not to be in a Situation to result an Attack. The interior Part of the Garrifon is in Ruins in many Places, and the confiderable Number of People who were wounded and not actually killed by this Difatter remained without Affiftance.
