P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Proclamation of the 7th Day of May last, for granting Bounties for the encouraging of Seamen and Landmen to enter themselves on Board His Majesty's Ships of War, was, so far as respects the Bounties granted to Able and Ordinary Seamen, and Able-bodied Landmen, entering themselves in the Kingdom of Great Britain, and the Rewards to Persons discovering Seamen who might secrete themselves in this Kingdom, prolonged and extended, by His Majesty's Order in Council of the 27th of August last, until the 31st Day of this instant October: And whereas it is expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the said Bounties and Rewards should continue to be paid for some Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, by the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, That the Payment of such Bounties to Able and Ordinary Seamen and Able-bodied Landmen entering themselves in the Kingdom of Great Britain, to serve in His Majesty's Fleet, and also the Reward to Persons discovering Seamen who secrete themselves in this Kingdom, be continued to the 31st Day of December next inclusive:—Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

Dublin Castle, October 26, 1790.

Yesterday being the Anniversary of His Majesty's happy Accession to the Throne, at Noon the Great Guns at the Salute Battery in His Majesty's Park the

Phoenix were fired Three Rounds; and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn up in the Royal Square at the Barracks. In the Evening a Play was given by Order of his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant for the Entertainment of the Ladies; and at Night there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy.

Madrid, October 18.

Advices have been received here, since those of the 14th Instant, containing further Particulars of the terrible Calamities produced by the Earthquake, which happened at Oran in the Night of the 8th Instant. By these it appears that Twenty successive Shocks were felt at short Intervals. The whole City is destroyed, and a great Part of the Inhabitants and of the Garrison are buried under the Ruins. Almost all the Forts which cover that Place and it's District are open or destroyed, so as not to be in a Situation to resist an Attack. The interior Part of the Garrison is in Ruins in many Places, and the considerable Number of People who were wounded and not actually killed by this Disaster remained without Assistance.
