AT the Court at St. James's, the 20th of October, 1790,

P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Proclamation of the 7th Day of May last, for granting Bounties for the encouraging of Seamen and Landmen to enter themselves on Board His Majesty's Ships of War, was, so far as respects the Bounties granted to Able and Ordinary Seamen, and Able-bodied Landmen, entering themselves in the Kingdom of Great Britain, and the Rewards to Persons discovering Seamen who might secrete themselves in this Kingdom, prolonged and extended, by His Majesty's Order in Council of the 27th of August last, until the 31st Day of this instant October: And whereas it is expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the said Bounties and Rewards should continue to be paid for some Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, by the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, That the Payment of such Bounties to Able and Ordinary Seamen and Able-bodied Landmen entering themselves in the Kingdom of Great Britain, to serve in His Majesty's Fleet, and also the Reward to Persons discovering Seamen who secrete themselves in this Kingdom, be continued to the 31st Day of December next inclusive:—Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

The King has been pleased to grant to Captain William Douglas Clephane, of Carlisle, in the County of Fife, Lieutenant in His Majesty's Third Regiment of Foot Guards, and his Issue, His Royal Licence and Authority to take and use the Surname of Maclean, in Addition to that of Clephane; and also to order that this His Majesty's Concession and Declaration be registered in His College of Arms.
