The humble Address of the Lord Provost, Magistrates and Common Council of the City of Glasgow.

WE, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Lord Provost, Magistrates and Common Council of the City of Glasgow, beg Leave to approach your Majesty's Throne with our Congratulations that the Prospect this Country lately had of being involved in the Calamities of War is now at an End.

Senfible of the Blessings of Peace to this Commercial Nation, we trust that the proper and spirited Measures of your Majesty, aided by the Efforts of a free and loyal People, as eager in asserting and defending their own Rights, as cautious of invading those of others, will be sufficient to prevent the Ambition or Jealousy of any of the neighbouring Powers from again disturbing the Tranquillity of your Dominions; and we fervently pray that your Majesty may long reign over these Kingdoms in Peace and Prosperity.

That upon the Statements delivered in by the Petitioners the faid Select Committee have determined. "That the Right of Election for the City and Liberty of Westminster is in the Inhabitants, Householders paying Scot and Lot, within the united Parishes of Saint Margaret and Saint John, and the several Parishes of Saint Paul Covent-Garden, Saint Ann "Saint James, Saint George Hanover-Square, in the Liberty of Saint Martin-le-Grand in the County of Middlesex, and in so much of the Parishes of Saint Martin in the Fields, Saint Clement Danes, and Saint Mary-le-Strand, as " are not within any of the Four Wards of the "Liberty of the Dutchy of Lancaster."
