THE King has been pleased to grant to Sir Henry Pawlet St. John, of Dogmersfield in the County of Southampton, and of Marks Hall in Essex, Bart. His Royal Licence and Authority that he and his Issue by Jane his present Wife, eldest Daughter and Coheir of Carew Mildmay, of Shawford in the County of Southampton, Esq; may assume the Surname of Mildmay in Addition to their present Surname, and also bear the Arms of Mildmay, out of Respect to the said Family, and in Compliance with the last Will and Testament of Carew Harvey Mildmay, of Marks Hall aforesaid, Esq; deceased, Great Uncle of the said Jane; such Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the Heralds Office: And also to order that this His Majesty's Concession and Declaration be registered in His College of Arms.

Stockholm, November 23.

The King of Sweden Yesterday held a Chapter of his Orders, in which several Promotions were declared.

Baron Armfelt, Count Munk, General Platen, and Count Oxenstierna, (formerly Minister for Foreign Affairs) were created Knights of the Order of St. Seraphim. The same Distinction has been conferred on the Russian General Baron d'Igelstroem.

M. de Wachtmeister, (Gentleman of the Bedchamber to his Swedish Majesty) Baron Rclamb, Baron d'Uglas, M. de Liljehorn, and M. de Franc, (who has lately been placed at the Foreign Department, in the Room of Count Duben, who retires on Account of his Health) were raised to the Rank of Commanders of the Order of the Polar Star; and Rear-Admiral Modée to that of Commander of the Order of the Sword.
