THE SOVEREIGN.

The Sovereign and Knights Companions Bring feated, the Chancellor fignified to the Chapter the Sourceign's Pleature for filling up the Three vacant States. The Chapter then proceeded to Election, and the Suffrages being collected by the Chancellor and preferted to the Sovereign, his Serene Highness the Dake of Saxe Gotha was: by His Majelty's Com-tand de larged data is allocat mand, declared duly elected.

And as by the Statutes none but a Knight can be e'estel, Garter and Black Rol were fent to introduce his Grace the Duke of Leed, who was knighted by the Sovereign with the Sword of State. Then the Earl of Chatham was introduced, and

knighted with the like Ceremonies,

After which the Knights Companions proceeded to a Second Election, and the Suffrages being collected by the Chancellor and prefented to the Sove-reign, his Grace Francis Dake of Leeds was, by His Majefty's Command, declared duly elect d; his Grace was thereupon received at the Door of the United with the Reft of your Maiefty's Subjects Chapter Room by the Two Junior Keights, and in Duty and Affection to your facted Perfor and

conducted between them to the Sovereign, preceded by Garter (bearing the Enfigns of the Order on a Cufhion) and Black Red.

Garter prefenting the Garter to the Sovereign, His Majefly delivered it to the Two Senior Knighte, who buckled it on his Grace's Left Leg, the Chancellor pronouncing the Admonition.

Garter then prefented the Ribbon with the George to the Sovereign; and his Grace kneeling down, to the Sovereign, and his Grace kneeling down, the Sovereign, with the Alfillance of the Two Senior Knights, put it over his Shoulder, the Chancellor in the mean Time propounding the Admonition; and the Dake having killed His Majelly's Hand, and feverally faluted the Knights prefer, withdrew.

The Chapter proceeded to a Third Election, and the Suffrages being collected as before, John Earl of Chatham was, by His Maje ty's Command, declared duly elected, and his Lordihip was introduced and invefied with the Garter, Ribbon and George in the fame Manner as the Duke of Leeds had been ; and the like Formalities having been observed, he wit idrew.

Garter then colling over the K lights, a Procession was made back to His Majefty's Apariment in the Order as before.
