Whitehall, December 21.

THIS Morning the Right Honourable Lord Henry Spencer, His Majesty's Secretary of Embassy, and Minister Plenipotentiary at the Hague, arrived at the Office of his Grace the Duke of Leeds, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, with a Convention relative to the Affairs of the Aultrian Netherlands, which was signed at the Hague on the 10th Instant, (sub Spe rati) by his Excellency Lord Auckland, His Majesty's Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to the States General, and by the Plenipotentiaries of Their Imperial and Prussian Majesties, and of Their High Mightinesses the States General.

Whitehall, December 21.

The King has been pleased to grant to Fyff Burgh, of West Drayton, in the County of Middlesex, Esq; and his Issue, His Royal Licence and Authority to assume and use the Surname of De Burgh, he being descended from one of the Daughters and Coheirs of Thomas Lord Burgh, one of whose Ancestors was originally stiled De Burgh: And also to order that this His Majesty's Concession and Declaration be registered in His College of Arms.
