The Guns in the Park and at the Tower were fired at One o'Clock. There was a Ball at Court in the Evening; and Illuminations and other Public Demonstrations of Joy in London and Westminster.

It appears by the Advices from India, brought by the Houghton, one of the Company's Ships, that Major-General Medows had taken the Command of the Army which had been collected in the Carnatic, and had marched into the Dominions of Tippoo Sultan; and that Carcoot, Daraporam, and Combetour had been taken by him without Resistance. Major Maitland, who is arrived in the Houghton, also brings an Account of the Surrender of Dindigul.

The Letters from the Government of Bengal contain the Information, that Treaties of Alliance had been finally concluded by that Government with the Marattas, and the Nizam; and that Lord Cornwallis had received from the Comte de Conway, Governor-General of the French Possessions to the Eastward of the Cape of Good Hope, the most unequivocal Assurances of perfect Neutrality.
