The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this Day read at
the Board, the humble Petition of several
Merchants of London, in Behalf of
themselves and others trading to Spain, humbly
praying, for the Reasons therein contained, that
all Ships coming from the Ports of Spain within
the Mediterranean, laden with Fruit, Wine, and
other Goods not enumerated in the Quarantine
Regulations, may, on the same being verified to the
Officers to the Customs at the Ports where such Ships
may arrive, be freely admitted to Entry without per-
forming Quarantine; His Majesty, having taken the
said Petition into Consideration, and being desirous
to remove all Obstructions upon Trade, so far as
may be consistent with the Health and Safety of His
Subjects, is pleased, with the Advice of His Privy
Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the
Quarantine at present subsisting upon all Ships and
Vessels coming from or through the Mediterranean,
be taken off, so far as respects Ships and Vessels
coming directly from any of the Ports of the King-
dom of Spain, within the Mediterranean, or from
the Island of Minorca, laden with the Products of
Spain only; and that all such Ships, and also all
Ships and Vessels arriving from the Town or Port of
Gibraltar, be permitted to discharge their respective
Ladings without unpacking, opening and airing,
and without performing any Quarantine: Provided
that the Cargo on board such Ships shall consist
entirely of Articles not enumerated in the Orders of
Council directing the Performance of Quarantine,

except any Bags, Straw, Matting or Plating on
Jars, which shall have been solely made use of as
Package for the said non-enumerated Articles: And
provided, also that they bring with them clean Bills
of Health, and that the Master or Person taking
Charge of such Ship or Vessel do first make Answer,
upon Oath, before the Superintendent of Quarantine,
or other Person appointed for that Service, to the
printed Questions usually put to the Masters of Ships
coming from Places from whence Quarantine is
required to be performed; and that by the said Answers;
which shall be transmitted by the said Superintendent
or other Person appointed to set Quarantine performed,
to the Principal Officers of the Customs, or to the
Chief Magistrate at the Place to which the Ship is
bound, it shall appear, to the Satisfaction of the said
Principal Officers or Chief Magistrate, that such
Ship did not touch at any infected Place, nor had Com-
munication with any infected Ship or Vessel, during
the Voyage, and that the Crew is free from Infection.
— And the Lord Commissioners of His Majesty's
Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office
of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord
Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General
of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War,
and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the
Time being of the Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Al-
derney, Sark and Man, are to give the necessary
Directions herein, as to their may respectively
appertain.

WHEREAS the Select Committee appointed to try and determine the Merits of the Petition of John Christian Curwen and Wilson Braddell, Esquires, and also of the Petition of the several Persons whose Names are thereto subscribed being Free-men and Citizens of the City of Carlisle, in the County of Cumberland, and having a Right to Vote in the Election of Citizens to serve in Parliament for the said City, severally complaining of an undue Election and Return for the said City of Carlisle, have this Day reported to the House of Commons, That it appeared to the said Select Committee, that the Merit of the Petitions did in Part depend upon the Right of Election; and that thereupon the said Committee required the Council for the several Parties to deliver to the Clerk of the said Committee Statements in Writing of the Right of Election for which they respectively contended. That in consequence thereof the Counsel for the Petitioners John Christian Curwen and Wilson Braddell, Esquires, and also for the Petitioners the Free-men and Citizens of the City of Carlisle, in the County of Cumberland, having a Right to vote in the Election of Citizens to serve in Parliament for the said City, delivered in a Statement as follows:—The Counsel for the Petitioners state the Right of Election to be in the Free-men of the City of Carlisle duly admitted and born Free-men of the said City, and deriving their Title to such Freedom, by bringing Sons of Free-men, or by Service of Seven Years Apprenticeship to a Freeman, resident during such Apprenticeship within the said City, or by Election of the Mayor and Common Council of the said City, with the Common-wealth and Approval of certain Persons called the Freemen, or heiswise the Fourts of the Election of each of the Eight Guilds or Occupations within the said City,

" as Representatives of the whole Commonalty of the said City."—" They also state that no Person is entitled to be admitted a Freeman of the said City who has not been previously admitted a Brother of one of the Eight Guilds or Occupations of the said City."—" That the Council for the Siting Members James Clarke Satterthwaite and Edward Knubley Esquires, delivered in a Statement as follows:—" The Council for the Siting Members state the Right of Election to be in the Freeman of the City of Carlisle, who acquire a Title to such Freedom by being Sons of Freemen, or by serving an Apprenticeship during Seven Years to a Freeman, or by Election of the Mayor, Aldermen, Bailiffs, and Capital Citizens of the said City."—" They also state, that it is not necessary, in order to become a Freeman of the said City, to have been previously admitted a Brother of one of the Eight Guilds or Occupations within the said City." That upon the Statement delivered in by the Council for the said several Petitioners, the said Select Committee have determined, " That the Right of Election, as set forth in the said Statement, is not the Right of Election for the City of Carlisle, in the County of Cumberland." That upon the Statement delivered in by the Council for the Siting Members, the said Select Committee have determined, " That the Right of Election, as set forth in the said Statement, is not the Right of Election for the said City of Carlisle." That the said Select Committee, having duly considered the said Statements, and the Evidence adduced before them, touching the Right of Election for the said City of Carlisle, have determined, " That the Right of Election for the City of Carlisle, in the County of Cumberland, is in the Freeman of the said City, duly admitted and sworn Freeman of the said City, having been previously admitted Brethren of one of the Eight Guilds or Occupations of the said City, and deriving their Title to such Freedom by being Sons of Freemen, or by Service of Seven Years Apprenticeship to a Freeman resident during such Apprenticeship within the said City, and in no others." I do hereby give this Notice, in pursuance of the Directions of the Act made in the Twenty-eighth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, " An Act for the further Regulation of the Trials of Controverted Elections, or Returns of Members to serve in Parliament."
