PUrsuant to an Act of Parliament passed in the Twenty-fixth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, this is to give Notice to the Concerned, that Information has been fent to this Office, That the Ship Valck, of Amsterdam, Burthen about 800 Tons, whereof G. G. Hepner was Master, bound on a Voyage to Batavia, lalen with Masts, Iron, Lead and Foreign Silver Coin, on the 26th of last Month struck on Happisburgh Sand, by which Accident she became very leaky, and by the Violence of the Sea the Master and Two of the Mariners were washed overboard and drowned: That on the 28th the Ship floated off the Sand, and, with the Affishance of Two small Fishing Vessels, the remaining Part of the Crew and Passengers, with Nine Chosts (supposed to contain Dollars and Papers) were faved and landed at Yarmouth in the County of Norfolk. and that very foon afterwards the faid Ship fell on her Beam Ends, and floated away to Sea.

Dublin Castle, March 4, 1791.

Yesterday having been appointed for the Celebration of Her Majesty's Birth-Day, there was a numerous and splendid Appearance of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction to compliment his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant, before whom an Ode fet to Music was performed. At Three o'Clock the Great Guns at the Salute Battery in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired Three Rounds, and answered by Vollies from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn up in the Royal Square at the Barracks. In the Evening a Play was given by his Excellency to the Ladies; and at Night there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and other Demonstrations of Joy throughout the City.

W Hereas it has been represented to the Commission-irs of His Majesty's Customs, that on the 10th of December last, as James Cammell, Second Mate of the Rote Revenue Cutter was cruizing between Christ-Clurch and Eurst, in a Boat belonging to the said Gutter, he fell in with a large Smuggling Lugger near Becken Bury, and which was then landing her Corgo: That on his being discovered by the Grew of the said Lugger, they ordered him to come on Board, which the Officer refused, and immediately the Lugger got under Sail; chased the Custom-House Boat, and felonically fired several Shot at her: That the following Night about Eight o'Clock, a Boat belonging to the Swan Revenue Cutter, in the Service of the Customs, commanded by Taith Gredridge an Officer of the Remanded by Joseph Goodridge, an Officer of this Re-winue, fell in with the faid Lugger near Christ Church, which he immediately chafed, and came up with, when the Crew of the Lugger ordered the Officer and his Men on Board, when they forced below, and kept

a Guard over them, whilft the Lugger proceeded to the Westward, and at Two o'Clock next Morning landed ber Goods at Bourn Bottom, confishing of above 1000 Casks of Foreign Spirituous Liquors, some Tea and Tobacco. They then ordered the Officer and his Boat's Crew into their Boat, and dismissed them, after baving plundered the Boat of Fire Arms and some of her Ma-

The above Lugger is about 160 Tons Burthen, mounting Fourteen or Sixteen Guns, Nine and Eighteen Pounders, and is commanded by a Man about Thirty Years of Age, and full Six Feet high. The Crew in general were supposed to be Irish, and between 60 and 70 in Number. One of the Crew, a Man belonging to Hastings, in the County of Kent, is well

known to the Officers.

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bring-ing to Justice the Persons concerned in this Felony and Piracy, is bereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of the faid Offend rs (except the Commander of the faid Lugger) who shall discover his Accomplices, so that Two or more of them may be apprehended and convicted of either of the said Offences.
