PRESENT,

The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council. HEREAS there was this Day read at the Board, the humble Petition of feveral Merchants of London, in Behalf of themselves and others trading to Spain, humbly praying, for the Reafons therein contained, that all Ships coming from the Ports of Spain within the Mediterranean, laden with Fruit, Wine, and other Goods not enumerated in the Quarantine Regulations, may, on the fame being verified to the Officers to the Culloms at the Ports where fuch Ships may arrive, be freely admitted to Entry without performing Ouarantine; His Majesty, having taken the faid Petition into Confideration, and being defirous to remove all Obstructions upon Trade, fo far as may be confiftent with the Health and Safety of His Subjects, is pleafed, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the Quarantize at prefent fubfifting upon all Ships and Veffels coming from or through the Mediterranean, be taken off, fo far as respects Ships and Veffels coming directly from any of the Ports of the Kingdom of Spain, within the Mediterranean, or from the Island of Minorca, laden with the Products of

Spain only; and that all fuch Ships, and alfo all Ships and Veffels arriving from the Town or Port of Gibraltar, be permitted to discharge their respective Ladings without unpacking, opening and airing, and without performing any Quarantine : Provided that the Cargo on board fuch Ships shall confist entirely of Articles not enumerated in the Orders of Council directing the Performance of Quarantine, except any Bags, Straw, Matting or Platting on [ars, which fhall have been folely made use of as Package for the faid non-enumerated Articles : And provided also that they bring with them clean Bills of Health, and that the Master or Person taking Charge of fuch Ship or Veffel do first make Answer. upon Oath, before the Superintendant of Quarantine, or other Perfon appointed for that Service, to the printed Queftions usually put to the Masters of Ships coming from Places from whence Quarantine is required to be performed ; and that by the faid Anfwers, which shall be transmitted by the faid Superintendant or other Perfon appointed to feeQuarantine performed, to the Principal Officers of the Cultoms, or to the Chief Magistrate at the Place to which the Ship is bound, it shall appear, to the Satisfaction of the faid Principal Officers or Chief Magistrate, that such Ship did not touch at any infected Place, nor had Communication with any infected Ship or Veffel, during the

the Voyage, and that the Crew is free from Infection. — And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark and Man, are to give the necessfary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

WHEREAS it has been humbly represented to the King, that, in the Night of Tuesday the 4th of January last, the Ship Increase, Francis Pawson, Master, in the Service of the Office of Ordnance, was driven by a Storm into St. Bride's Bay, in the County of Pembroke, and was stranded on Druidston Sands, within the said Bay; and that a great Number of Perfons riotously assembled on Board the said Ship, and feloniously plundered her of warious Ordnance Stores and other Things, amongst whom was John Walters, of

His Majefty, for the better discovering and bring-; ing to Justice the faid John Walters, is hereby pleased to offer His most gracious Pardor to any one of the Persons concerned in plundering the said Ship, not in actual Custody, who shall discover the said John Walters, so that he may be apprehended and convicted. And, as a farther Encouragement, the Principal Officers of His Majefly's Ordnance do hereby promife a Reward of TWO HUNDRED POUNDS to any Perfon who will discover the faid John Walters, jo that he may be apprehended and convicted, to be paid by the Treafurer of the faid Office.

W Hereas it has been reprefented to the Commissioners of His Majefty's Cuftoms, that on the 10th of December last, as James Cammell, Second Mate of the Role Revenue Custter was cruizing between Chrift-Church and Hurst, in a Boat belonging to the faid Cutter, he fell in with a large Smuggling Lugger near Becken Bury, and which was then landing her Cargo: That on his being discovered by the Creve of the faid Lugger, they ordered him to come on Board, which the Dagger, they ordered bin to come on Bara, conto the Officer refused, and immediately the Lugger got under. Sail, chaled the Custom-House Boat, and feloniously fired several Shot at her: That the following Night about Eight o'Clock, a Boat belonging to the Swan Revenue Custer, in the Service of the Customs, com-manded by Joseph Goodridge, an Officer of this Revenue, fell in with the faid Lugger near Chrift Church, which he immediately chafed, and came up with, when the Grew of the Lugger ordered the Officer and bis Men on Board, whom they forced below, and kept, a Guard over them, whild the Lugger proceeded to the Westward, and at Two o'Clock next Morning landed ber Goods at Bourn Bottom, confifting of above 1000 Cafks of Foreign Spirituous Liquors, fome Tea and Tobacco. They then ordered the Officer and his Boat's Crew into their Boat, and difmiffed them, ofter having plundered the Boat of Fire Arms and jome of her Materials.

The above Lugger is about 160 Tons Burthen, meaning Fourteen or Sixteen Guns, Nine and Eigbteen Pounders, and is commanded by a Man about. Thirty Years of Age, and full Six Feet high. The Crew in general were fuppoied to be Irifb, and between 60 and 70 in Number One of the Crew, a Man belonging to Haftings, in the County of Kent, is well known to the Officers.

His Majefty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in this Felony and Piracy, is bereby pleased to promise His most gracious Parson to any one of the said Cifes drs (except the Commander of the faid Lugger) who shall discover bis Accomplices, so that Two or more of them may be apprebended and convicted of either of the said Offences.
