A^T the Court at St. James's, the 2d of March, 1791,

P R E S E N T, The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS there was this Day read at the Board, the humble Petition of feveral Merchants of London, in Behalf of theinfelves and others trading to Spain, humbly praying, for the Reafons therein contained, that all Ships coming from the Ports of Spain within the Mediterranean, laden with Fruit, Wine, and other Goods not enumerated in the Quarantine Regulations, may, on the fame being verified to the Officers to the Cuftoms at the Ports where fuch Ships may arrive, be freely admitted to Entry without performing Quarartine; His Majesty, having taken the faid Petition into Confideration, and being defirous to remove all Obstructions upon Trade, fo far as may be confiftent with the Health and Safety of His Subjects, is pleafed, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the Quarantine at prefent fubfifting upon all Ships and Veffels coming from or through the Mediterranean, be taken off, fo far as respects Ships and Vessels coming directly from any of the Ports of the Kingdom of Spain, within the Mediterranean, or from she Island of Minorca, laden with the Products of

Spain only; and that all fuch Ships, and alfo all Ships and Veffels arriving from the Town or Port of Gibraltar, be permitted to discharge their respective Ladings without unpacking, opening and airing, and without performing any Quarantine : Provided that the Cargo on board fuch Ships shall consist entirely of Articles not enumerated in the Orders of Council directing the Performance of Quarantine, except any Bags, Straw, Matting or Plating on lars, which shall have been folely made use of as Package for the faid non-enumerated Articles : And provided alfo that they bring with them clean Bills of Health, and that the Mafter or Person taking Charge of fuch Ship or Veffel do first make Answer, upon Oath, before the Superintendant of Quarantine, or other Perfon appointed for that Service, to the printed Questions usually put to the Masters of Ships coming from Places from whence Quarantine is required to be performed; and that by the faid Anfwers. which shall be transmitted by the faid Superintendant or other Perfon appointed to feeQuarantine performed. to the Principal Officers of the Cuftoms, or to the Chief Magistrate at the Place to which the Ship is bound, it shall appear, to the Satisfaction of the faid Principal Officers or Chief Magistrate, that such Ship did not touch at any infected Place, nor had Communication with any infected Ship or Veffel, during the
