A PROCLAMATION,

For Encouraging Seamen and Landmen to enter themfelves on Board His Majesty's Ships of War.

GEORGE R. THEREAS it is Our Royal Intention to give all due Encouragement to all fuch Seamen and Landmen who fhall voluntatily enter themselves in Our Service ; We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation : And We do hereby promife and declare, That all fuch Able Seamen, not above the Age of Fifty; nos under the Age of Twenty Years, fit for Our Service, who shall, on or before the Thirty-first Day of May next, voluntarily enter themfelves to ferve in Our Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of Our Ships, or Officers employed in Tenders, or at Rendezvous on Shore, for Raifing Men for the Service of Our Navy, shall-receive, as Our Royal Bounty, the Sum of Three Pounds each Man; and all fuch Ordinary Seamen, of the Ages above mentioned, fit for Our Service, who fhall fo enter themfelves as aforefaid, fhall receive the Sum of Two Pounds each Man: And all fuch Able-Bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who shall fo enter themselves as aforefaid, fhail receive the Sum of Twenty Shillings each Man, as Our Royal Bounty; fuch refpective Sums to be paid them by the refpective Clerks of

the Ships, into which they shall be entered, shall be, immediately after the Third Muster of fuch Seamen and Landmen. And We do declare; thatthe Qualifications of the Seamen and Landmen, fo entering themfelves as aforefaid, shall be certified by the Captain, Master, and Boatswain of the Ship or Vessel where they shall enter. And, for Prevention of any Abufes, by any Perfons leaving the Veffels to which they shall belong, and entering themfelves on Board any other Our Ships or Veffels, in order to obtain the faid Bounty-Money, We do hereby declare and command, that fuch Scamen and Landmen, belonging to any of Our Ships or Veffels, as shall absent themselves from any of the faid Ships or Veffels to which they fhell belong, and shall enter themselves on Board any other of Our faid Ships or Veffels, in order to obtain the faid Bounty, shall not only lose the Wages due to them in the Ships or Veffels they shall loave, but also be feverely punished according to their Demerits.
