## A PROCLAMATION,

For Recalling and Probibiting Seamen foom ferving Foreign Princes and States, and for granting Rewards for difcovering fuch Seamen as shall conceal them/elwes.

GEORGE R.

7 HEREAS We are informed, That great Numbers of Mariners and Seafaring Men, Our natural-born Subjects, are in the Service of divers Foreign Princes and States, to the Prejudice of Our Kingdom; We have therefore thought it neceffary, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation; and do hereby ftrictly charge and command all Mafters of Ships, Pilots, Mariners, Seamen, Shipwrights, and other Seafaring Men whatfoever and wherefoever, (being Our natural-born Subjects) who are in the Pay or Service of any Foreign Prince or State, or do ferve in any Foreign Ship or Veffel, that forthwith they, and every of them, do (according to their known and bounden Duty and Allegiance) withdraw themfelves, depart from, and quit fuch Foreign Services, and return Home to their Native Countries. And further, We do hereby firicity prohibit and forbid all Masters of Ships, Pilots, Mariners, Seamen, Shipwrights, and other Seafaring Men whatfoever, (being Our natural-born Subjects) from entering, and do charge and command them, and every of them, from henceforth, to forbear to enter themfelves into the Pay or Service of any Foreign Prince or State, or to ferve in any Foreign Ship or Veffel whatfoever, without Our special Licence first had and obtained in that Behalf; to all which We expect due Obedience and exact Conformity. And We do hereby publish and declare, that the Offenders to the contrary shall not only incur Our just Displeasure, but be proceeded against for their Contempt according to the utmost Severities of the Law. And We do hereby declare, that if any fuch Mafters of Ships, Pilots, Mariners, Seamen, Shipwrights, or other Seafaring Men, (being Our Subjects) shall be take. in any Foreign Service by the Turks, Algerines, or any others, they shall not be reclaimed by Us as Subjects of Great Britain. And we do hereby further promife and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman shall be paid any Perfon who shall discover any Seama or Seamen who may conceal him or themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen shall be taken for our faid Service, on or before the 31ft Day of Maynext, by any of Our Sea Officers appointed to raife Men on Shore, or by the Captains and Commanders of any of |

Our Ships or Veffels in the Ports, or on the Coafts of this Kingdom, the faid Rewards to be paid for any Seaman or Seamen, fo difcovered and taken in and about London, by the Principal Officers and Commissioners of Our Navy ; and at the Out-Ports by the Clerks of the Cheque at Deptford, Woolwich, Chatham, Sheernefs, Portfmouth, or Plymouth, or the Naval Officers at Harwich or Deal respectively ; and (where there are no Clerks of the Cheque or Naval Officers) by the Collector or proper Officer of Our Cultoms at the Port which may be nearest to the Place where fuch Seaman or Seamen shall be taken, immediately upon a Certificate being produced to the faid Principal Officers and Commiffioners of Our Navy, Clerks of the Cheque, Naval Officers, Collectors or proper Officers of the Cuftoms, respectively, by the Person who may make Discovery of any Seaman or Seamen as aforefaid, certifying his Name, and the Name or Names and Number of Seamen procured in confequence of his Difcovery; the faid Certificate to be given by fuch Officer as may take fuch Seaman or Seamen for Our Service; and the Amount of all Payments, fo to be made by the Collectors or proper Officers of Our Cuffoms. to be reimburfed to them by the Principal Officers and Commissioners of Our Navy, as heretofore, upon authentic Accounts thereof being transmitted to the faid Principal Officers and Commiffioners of Our Navy by fuch Collectors or proper Officers of Our Cuftoms.
