By the KING, A PROCLAMATION,

For Encouraging Seamon and Landmen to enter themfelves on Board His Majefty's Ships of War.

GEORGE R.

THEREAS it is Our Royal Intention to give all due Encouragement to all fuch Seamen and Landmen who fhall voluntatily enter themselves in Our Service; We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation : And We do hereby promife and declare, That all fuch Able Seamen, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, fit for Our Service, who fhall, on or before the Thirty-first Day of May next, voluntarily enter themfelves to ferve in Our Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of Our Ships, or Officers employed in Tenders, or at Rendezvous on Shore, for Raifing Men for the Service of Our Navy, fhall receive, as Our Royal Bounty, the Sum of Three Pounds each Man; and all fuch Ordinary Seamen, of the Ages above mentioned, fit for Our Service, who shall fo enter themselves as aforefaid, shall receive the Sum of Two Pounds each Man: And all fuch Able-Bodied Landmen, not abovethe Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who shall fo enter themselves as aforefaid, shall receive the Sum of Twenty Shillings each Man, as Our Royal Bounty; fuch refpective Sums to be paid them by the refpective Clerks of the Cheque, refiding at the Ports or Places where the Ships, into which they shall be entered, shall be, immediately after the Third Mufter of fuch Seamen and Landmen. And We do declare, that

the Qualifications of the Seamen and Landmen, fo entering themselves as aforefaid, shall be certified by the Captain, Master, and Boatswain of the Ship' or Veffel where they shall enter. And, for Prevention of any Abufes, by any Perfons leaving the Vefiels to which they fhall belong, and entering themfelves on Board any other Our Ships or Veffels, in order to obtain the faid Bounty-Money, We do hereby declare and command, that fuch Seamen and Landmen, belonging to any of Our Ships or Veffels, as shall absent themselves from any of the faid Ships or Veffels to which they fhall belong, and shall enter themselves on Board any other of Our faid Ships or Vessels, in order to obtain the faid Bounty, fhall not only lofe the Wages due to them in the Ships or Veffels they shall leave, but also be feverely punished according to their Demerits.

W HEREAS We are informed, That great Numbers of Mariners and Seafaring Men, Our natural-born Subjects, are in the Service of divers Foreign Princes and States, to the Prejudice of Our Kingdom; We have therefore thought it neceffary, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish
