THE King has been pleased to grant to Bernard Bowes Foord, Esq; Captain in His Majesty's 26th Regiment of Foot, (eldest Son of the Reverend Doctor Bernard Foord, by Ann his Wife, Niece of William Bowes, late of the City of York, Esq; deceased) His Royal Licence and Authority that he and his Issue may take and use the Surnames of Foord Bowes, instead of Bowes Foord.

The King has been pleased to grant to the Reverend Robert Hele Selby, Master of Arts, Rector of Colmworth in the County of Bedford, Fellow of Exeter College, Oxon, and Chaplain to His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, His Royal Licence and Authority that he and his Issue may assume the Surname and bear the Arms of Hele, in Addition to those of Selby, in Compliance with the Desire of his Uncle John Hele, of Charlotte-street, in the Parish of St. Pancras, in the County of Middlesex, Esquire; such Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the Heralds Office.

And also to order that these His Majesty's several Concessions and Declarations be registered in His College of Arms.

The King has pleased to constitute and appoint the Earl of Leven to be His Majesty's High Commissioner to the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland.
