Warfaw, May 3.

The new Constitution has just passed in the Diet, by which the Elector of Saxony is declared immediate Successor to the Throne of Poland; after whose Demise his Daughter is to inherit; and the Choice of her Husband, if she marries, is to be decided by the States. After this Conflitution had passed, the King, attended by the Marshals of the Diet, and a great Number of the Members, went to the Cathedral, and took an Oath to maintain it.
