P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the Twenty-fifth Day of March last, to promise and declare, That a Bounty of Three Pounds should be paid to every Able Seaman, and of Two Pounds to every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, fit for His Majesty's Service, and a Bounty of Twenty Shillings to all such Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Thirty-first Day of May then next, voluntarily enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majesty's Ships, or Officers employed in Tenders, or at Rendezvous on Shore for raising Men for the Service of His Majesty's Navy. And whereas His Majesty was also pleased, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the Sixth Day of April last, to promise and declare, That a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman should be paid, in the Manner thereby directed, to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal themselves, so that such Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service on or before the said Thirty-first Day of May then next, by any of

His Majesty's Sea Officers appointed to raise Men on Shore, or by the Captains and Commanders of any of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels in the Ports or on the Coasts of this Kingdom. And when the Time limited for Payment of the said Bounties and Rewards is near expiring, and it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service that the said Bounties and Rewards should continue to be paid for some Time longer; His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby ordered, That the Time limited for Payment of the said Bounties and Rewards be prolonged and extended from the said Thirty-first of this instant May to the Thirtieth Day of June next, inclusive: — Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

General Post Office, Saturday, May 28, 1791.

THE Post-Boy bringing the Mail from Ailebury to Hemel Hempstead, containing the Bags of Letters from Ailebury, Winslow, Tring, Wendover and Berkhamstead for London, with the Bye-Letters from Ailebury and Tring, was stoop between the Hours of Ten and Eleven o'Clock last Night by a Man on Foot, who appeared to be lusty, between Berkhamstead and Hemel Hempstead, who seized the Bridle of his Horse, and made him dismount. The Robber then fastened the Horse to a Gate on the Road, and took the Boy into a Field at some Distance, where he tied his Hands, blindfolded him and fastened him to a Gate, and afterwards rode away with the Mail and Horse.

Whoever shall apprehend and convict, or cause to be apprehended and convicted, the Person who committed this Robbery, will be entitled to a Reward of TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, over and above the Reward given by Act of Parliament for apprehending of Highwaymen; or if any Person, whether an Accomplice in the Robbery, or knowing thereof, shall make Discovery, whereby the Person who committed the same may be apprehended and brought to Justice, such Discoverer will, upon Conviction of the Party, be entitled to the same Reward, and will also receive His Majesty's most gracious Pardon.
