The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**THEREAS** His Majefty was gracioufly pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the Tventy-fifth Day of March laft, to promife and declary. That a Bounty of Three Pounds should be paid to every Able Seaman, and of Two Pounds to every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, fit for His Majesty's Service, and a Bounty of Twenty Shillings to all fuch Ablebodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirtyfive, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Thirty-first Day of May then next, voluntarily enter themfelves to ferve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majesty's Ships, or Officers employed in Tenders, or at Rendezvous on Shore for raifing Men for the Service of His Majefty's Navy. And whereas His Majefty was alfo pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the Sixth Day of April laft, to promife and declare, That a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman fliould be paid, in the Manner thereby directed, to any Perfon who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service on or before the faid Thirty-first Day of May then next, by any of

on Shore, or by the Captains and Commanders of any of His Majefly's Ships or Veffe's in the Ports or on the Coafts of this Kingdom. And when at the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Rewards is near expiring, and it being judged expedient for His Majefly's Service that the faid Bounties and Rewards fhould continue to be paid for fome Time longer; His Majefly, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby ordered. That the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Rewards be prolonged and extended from the faid Thirty-first of this inflant May to the Thirtieth Day of June next, inclusive : — Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

General Post Office, Saturday, May 28, 1791-

THE Post-Boy bringing the Mail from Ailesbury to Hemel Hempflead, containing the Bags of Letters from Ailefbury, Winflow, Tring, Wendover and Berkbampstead for London, with the Bye-Letters from Ailefbury and Tring, was flopt between the Hours of Ten and Eleven o'Clock last Night by a Man on Foot, who appeared to be luffy, between Berkhampficad and Hemel Hempstead, who seized the Bridle of bis Herse, and made him dismount. The Robber then fastened the Horfe to a Gate on the Road, and took the Boy into a Field at fome Diftance, where he tied his Handi, blindfolded him and fastened him to a Gate, and asterwards rode away with the Mail and Horfe.

Whoever shall apprehend and convict, or cause to be apprehended and convicted, the Perfon who committed this Robbery, will be entitled to a Reword of TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, over and above the Reward given by Act of Parliament for apprehending of Highwaymen; or if any Perfon, whether an Accom-plice in the Robbery, or knowing thereof, fhall make Difcovery, whereby the Perfon who committed the fame may be apprehended and brought to Justice, such Dis-coverer will, upon Conviction of the Party, be entitled to the fame Reward, and will also receive His Majefty's most gracious Pardon.
