General Post Office, Saturday, May 28, 1791.

THE Post-Boy bringing the Mail from Ailesbury to Hemel Hempstead, containing the Bags of Letters from Ailesbury, Winslow, Tring, Wendower and Berk-hampstead for London, with the Bye-Letters from Ailesbury and Tring, was stopt between the Hours of Ten and Eleven o'Clock last Night by a Man on Foot, who appeared to be lusty, between Berkhampsteed and Hemel Hempstead, who seized the Bridle of his Horse, and made him dismount. The Robber then sastened the Horse to a Gate on the Road, and took the Boy into a Field at some Distance, where he tied his Hands, blindsolded him and fastened him to a Gate, and afterwards rode away with the Mail and Horfe.

Whoever shall apprehend and convict, or cause to be apprehended and convicted, the Person who committed this Robbery, will be entitled to a Reword of TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, over and above the Reword given by Atl of Parliament for apprehending of Highwaymen; or if any Person, whether an Accomplice in the Robbery, or knowing thereof, shall make Discovery, whereby the Person who committed the same may be apprehended and brought to Justice, such Discoverer will, upon Conviction of the Party, be entitled to the same Reward, and will also receive His Majesty's most gracious Pardon.
