The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. 7HEREAS by an Act passed in the Thirtieth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act to continue, for a limited Time, certain " Provisions contained in an Act made in this prefent « Seffion of Parliament, intituled, An Act for in-" demnifying all Perfons who have been concerned \* in advising or carrying into Execution certain Or-" ders of Council respecting the Importation and Ex-" portation of Corn and Grain, and alfo certain " Orders islued by the Governor-General of His " Majefty's Colonies in America, and for preventing " Suits in confequence of the fame, and for mak-" ing further Provisions relative thereto, relating w to the Importation and Exportation of Corn and " Grain, and to authorize His Majesty to permit " the Exportation of Corn, Grain, Meal or Flour, " and to prohibit the Importation thereof on the low " Dut es," it was enacted, that at any Time before the 28th Day of February, 1791, it should be lawful for His Majefly, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, (among other Things) to prohibit, for a limited Time, the Importation on the low Duties of Foreign Wheat, Wheat-Flour, Rye, Rye-Meal, Barley, Barley-Mcal, Oats, Oat-Meal, Peafe and

Beans, and in like Manner to recal fuch Prohibition, if Circumftances fhould appear fo to require; and all Perfons acting contrary to fuch Prohibition were thereby made liable to the Penalties and Forfeitures therein mentioned.

And whereas by an Act paffed in the laft Seffion of Parliament, intituled, "An Act to con-"tinue and amend fo much of Two Acts, made in the laft Seffion of Parliament, as relates to the Importation and Exportation of Corn and Grain, and to the authorizing His Majefty to "permit the Exportation of Corn, Grain, Meal or Flour, and to prohibit the Importation thereof on the low Duties," the faid before recited Act was further continued in Force until the 10th Day of June, 1791.

And whereas by virtue of the Powers vefted in His MajeRy by the before-mentioned ACts, His Majefty was pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, on the 13th Day of October, 1790, the 5th Day of January, the 18th Day of February, and the 23d Day of March, 1791, to make certain Orders for regulating the Importation of Foreign Wheat, Wheat-Flour, Rye, Rye-Meal, Barley, Barley-Meal, Oats, Oat-Meal, Peafe and Beans, which were to continue in Force, by virtue of the laft mentioned Order, until the 10th Day of this inftant) June.

And whereas by another Act, paffed in the laft Seffion of Parliament, intituled, "An Act for re-"gulating the Importation and Exportation of "Corn, and the Payment of the Duty on Foreign "Corn imported, and of the Bounty on Britifh "Corn exported," it was enacted, That for much of



the herein before-mentioned Act, intituled, " An " Act for indemnifying all Perfons who have been " concerned in advising or carrying into Execu-" tion certain Orders of Council respecting the " Importation and Exportation of Corn and Grain, " and also certain Orders issued by the Governor-" General of His Majesty's Colonies in America, " and for preventing Suits in confequence of the " fame, and for making further Provisions relative " thereto," as relates to the Importation and Exportation of Corn and Grain, and also the Whole of the above recited Act passed in the faid Thirtieth Year of His Majesty's Reiga, should continue and be in Force until the 15th Day of November, 1791; His Majefty is thereupon pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, pursuant to the Powers vested in His Majesty by the faid Act paffed in the last Seffion of Parliament, intituled, " An Act for regulating the Importation and Ex-" portation of Corn, and the Payment of the Duty " on Foreign Corn imported, and of the Bounty " on British Corn exported," to order, and doth hereby order, That fo much of the Regulations in each and every of the faid Orders respectively contained, as were in Force and Effect until the 10th Day of June, 1791, respecting the Importation of Foreign Wheat, Wheat-Flour, Rye, Rye-Meal, Barley, Barley-Meal, Oats, Oat-Meal, Peafe and Beans respectively, or warehousing the same respectively, shall be and continue in Force and Effect from the Day of the Date of this Order until the 15th Day of November, 1791, in like Manner, to all Intents and Purpofes, as the fame were in Force and Effect immediately before the faid 10th Day of June, 1791, unless His Majefty shall think fit, with the Advice aforefaid, to revoke the fame in Whole or in Part.

Royal Gardens, Kenfington, May : 1, 1791.

DIRECTIONS for making a Composition for curing Dilezics, Defects and Injuries in all Kinds of Fruit and Foleit Trees, and the wethod of preparing the Trees, and laying on the Com, officion, by William Forfyth.

Take One Bushel of fresh Cow Dung, Haif a Bushel of Lime Rubbish of old Buildings, (that from the Cielings of Rooms is preferable) Haif a Bushel or Wood Afnes, and a Sixteenth Part of a Buffel of Pit or River Sund. The Three last Ar-ticles are to be fifted fine before they are mixed; then work them well together with a Spade, and afterwards with a wooden Beater, until the Stuff is very imooth, like fine Plaister used for the Ciclings of Rooms.

for the Ciclings of Rooms. The Composition being thus made, Care must be taken to prepare the Tree properly for its Application, by cutting away all the dead, dreaged, and injured Part, till you come to the fresh found Wood; leaving the Surface of the Wood very fmooth, and rounding off the Edges of the Bark with a Draw-knite, or other Inftrument, perfectly fmooth, which must be particularly attended to: Then lay on the Plaitler, about One-eighth or an Inch thick, all over the Part where the Wood or Bark has been for cut away, finithing off the Edges as thin as possible. Then take a Quantity of dry Powder of Wood Afnes, mixed with a Sixth Part of the fame Quantity of the Afnets of burnt Bones; put fit into a Tin Box, with Holes in the Top, and fhake the Powder on the Surface of the Plaitler till the Wienele is covered over with it, letting it remain for Half an Hour, to abforb the Moifture: Then apply more Pow-der, rebeing it on gently with the Hand, and repeating the Application of the Powder, till the whole Plaitler becomes a dry, fmooth Surface.

dry, fmooth Surface. All Trees cut down near the Ground fhould have the Surface made quite fmooth, rounding it off in a small Degree, as be-fore mentioned; and the dry Powder directed to be used after-wards, fhould have an equal Quantity of Powder of Alabafter mixed with it, in order the better to refift the dripping of Trees

mixed with it, in order the better to refift the dripping of Trees and heavy Rains. If any of the Composition be left for a future Occasion, it should be kept in a Tub, or other Veffet, and Urine of any Kind poured on it, fo as to cover the Surface, otherwise the Atmosphere will greatly hurt the Efficacy of the Application. Where Lime Rubbih of old Buildings cannot be easily got, take powdered Chalk, or common Lime, after having been faked a Month at leaft.

As the Growth of the Tree will gradually affect the Plaifter, by raifing up its Edges next the Bark, Care hould be taken, where that happens, to rub it over with the Finger when Oc-cafion may require, (which is beft done when moistened by Rain) that the Plaifter may be kept whole, to prevent the Air Rain) that the Planter may be ner. and Wet from penetrating into the Wound.
