Notice to the Creditors of John Philp, Merchant, in Kirkcaldy, North Britain.

At a Meeting of his Creditors at Edinburgh the 26th of May last, a Proposal was made of paying a Dividend of Ten Shillings in the Pound; Four with Security in Six Months, Four in like Manner in Twelve Months, and the remaining Two upon Philp's own Acceptance at Eighteen Months; and from the State of his Affairs laid before that Meeting, it was the Opinion of those present, that the Terms offered should be accepted of; but in order to prevent Preferences, until the Sense of the whole Creditors should be obtained, it was thought proper to apply for a Sequestration, which has since been awarded: At a subsequent Meeting the 8th Day of June current, after an Interim Factor had been chosen, the former Proposal of a Composition was renewed, and the Creditors again unanimously gave their Assent thereto; but in order that they might finally resolve whether the Composition should be accepted of, or the Sequestration proceeded in, they appointed another Meeting to be held in John's Coffee-house, Edinburgh, on Wednesday the 6th Day of July next, at Twelve o'Clock at Noon; and as it is of Consequence that this Meeting should be as full as possible, the Attendance of the Creditors is earnestly requested; and such of them who find that inconvenient, or who have not authorized Persons in Scotland to appear for them, will signify their Intentions before the Day of Meeting, to Thomas Scotland, Writer in Edinburgh, Agent in the Sequestration.
