AT the Court at St James's, the 10th Day of June, 1791,

P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Thirtieth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to continue, for a limited Time, certain Provisions contained in an Act made in this present Session of Parliament, intituled, An Act for indemnifying all Persons who have been concerned in advising or carrying into Execution certain Orders of Council respecting the Importation and Exportation of Corn and Grain, and also certain Orders issued by the Governor-General of His Majesty's Colonies in America, and for preventing Suits in consequence of the same, and for making further Provisions relative thereto, relating to the Importation and Exportation of Corn and Grain, and to authorize His Majesty to permit the Exportation of Corn, Grain, Meal or Flour, and to prohibit the Importation thereof on the low Duties," it was enacted, that at any Time before the 28th Day of February, 1791, it should be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, (among other Things) to prohibit, for a limited Time, the Importation on the low Duties of Foreign Wheat, Wheat-Flour, Rye, Rye-Meal, Barley, Barley-Meal, Oats, Oat-Meal, Pease and Beans, and in like Manner to recal such Prohibition, if Circumstances should appear so to require; and all Persons acting contrary to such Prohibition were

thereby made liable to the Penalties and Forfeitures therein mentioned.

And whereas by an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, "An Act to continue and amend so much of Two Acts, made in the last Session of Parliament, as relates to the Importation and Exportation of Corn and Grain; and to the authorizing His Majesty to permit the Exportation of Corn, Grain, Meal or Flour, and to prohibit the Importation thereof on the low Duties," the said before recited Act was further continued in Force until the 10th Day of June, 1791.

And whereas by virtue of the Powers vested in His Majesty by the before-mentioned Acts, His Majesty was pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, on the 13th Day of October, 1790, the 5th Day of January, the 18th Day of February, and the 23d Day of March, 1791, to make certain Orders for regulating the Importation of Foreign Wheat, Wheat-Flour, Rye, Rye-Meal, Barley, Barley-Meal, Oats, Oat-Meal, Pease and Beans, which were to continue in Force, by virtue of the last mentioned Order, until the 10th Day of this instant June.

And whereas by another Act, passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, "An Act for regulating the Importation and Exportation of Corn, and the Payment of the Duty on Foreign Corn imported, and of the Bounty on British Corn exported," it was enacted, That so much of

the herein before-mentioned Act, intituled, " An Act for indemnifying all Persons who have been concerned in advising or carrying into Execution certain Orders of Council respecting the Importation and Exportation of Corn and Grain, and also certain Orders issued by the Governor-General of His Majesty's Colonies in America, and for preventing Suits in consequence of the same, and for making further Provisions relative thereto," as relates to the Importation and Exportation of Corn and Grain, and also the Whole of the above recited Act passed in the said Thirtieth Year of His Majesty's Reign, should continue and be in Force until the 15th Day of November, 1791; His Majesty is thereupon pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, pursuant to the Powers vested in His Majesty by the said Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, " An Act for regulating the Importation and Exportation of Corn, and the Payment of the Duty on Foreign Corn imported, and of the Bounty on British Corn exported," to order, and doth hereby order, That so much of the Regulations in each and every of the said Orders respectively contained, as were in Force and Effect until the 10th Day of June, 1791, respecting the Importation of Foreign Wheat, Wheat-Flour, Rye, Rye-Meal, Barley, Barley-Meal, Oats, Oat-Meal, Pease and Beans respectively, or warehousing the same respectively, shall be and continue in Force and Effect from the Day of the Date of this Order until the 15th Day of November, 1791, in like Manner, to all Intents and Purposes, as the same were in Force and Effect immediately before the said 10th Day of June, 1791, unless His Majesty shall think fit, with the Advice aforesaid, to revoke the same in Whole or in Part.

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty-fifth Day of March last, to promise and declare, that a Bounty of Three Pounds should be paid to every Able Seaman, and of Two Pounds to every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, fit for His Majesty's Service, and a Bounty of Twenty Shillings to all such Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty

Years, who should, on or before the Thirty-first Day of May then next, voluntarily enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majesty's Ships, or Officers employed in Tenders, or at Rendezvous on Shore for raising Men for the Service of His Majesty's Navy. And whereas His Majesty was also pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixth Day of April last, to promise and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman should be paid in the Manner thereby directed to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal themselves, so that such Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service on or before the said Thirty-first Day of May then next, by any of His Majesty's Sea Officers appointed to raise Men on Shore, or by the Captains and Commanders of any of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels in the Ports or on the Coasts of this Kingdom: And whereas the Time limited by the said Proclamations for the Payment of the said Bounties and Rewards hath been prolonged and extended to the Thirtieth Day of this instant June; and it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service that the said Bounties and Rewards should continue to be paid for some Time longer, His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the said Bounties and Rewards be prolonged and extended from the said Thirtieth Day of this instant June to the Thirty-first Day of July next, inclusive: Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

Turin, June 11.

A Dispute has lately taken Place in this Capital, between the Students of the University and the Police, which, from the prudent Conduct of the Government, has fortunately subsided without any bad Consequences. It was occasioned by the Arrest of one of the Students on a mistaken Charge; in consequence of which the other Members of the University insisted on the Officer asking Pardon publicly. This not being complied with, the Students assembled in considerable Numbers, and proceeded to some Acts of Violence. The Troops having been drawn out, and the Officer who had executed the Arrest having asked Pardon, the Tumult subsided without any further Consequences.

Paris, June 22.

Early in the Morning of Tuesday the 21st Instant Their Most Christian Majesties, with Their Family, and Monsieur and Madame, quitted Paris, and, as it is supposed, took the Route of Flanders.

General Post Office, Saturday, May 28, 1791.

THE Post-Boy bringing the Mail from Ailesbury to Hemel Hempstead, containing the Bags of Letters from Ailesbury, Winslow, Tring, Wendover and Berkhamstead for London, with the Bye-Letters from Ailesbury and Tring, was stop't between the Hours of Ten and Eleven o'Clock last Night by a Man on Foot, who appeared to be lusty, between Berkhamstead and Hemel Hempstead, who seized the Bridle of his Horse, and made him dismount. The Robber then fastened the Horse to a Gate on the Road, and took the Boy into a Field at some Distance, where he tied his Hands, blindfolded him and fastened him to a Gate, and afterwards rode away with the Mail and Horse.

Whoever shall apprehend and convict, or cause to be apprehended and convicted, the Person who committed this Robbery, will be entitled to a Reward of TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, over and above the Reward given by Act of Parliament for apprehending of Highwaymen; or if any Person, whether an Accomplice in the Robbery, or knowing thereof, shall make

Discovery, whereby the Person who committed the same may be apprehended and brought to Justice, such Discoverer will, upon Conviction of the Party, be entitled to the same Reward, and will also receive His Majesty's most gracious Pardon.
