The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. THEREAS by an Act passed in the Thirtieth

Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act to continue, for a limited Time, certain " Provisions contained in an Act made in this prefent " Seffion of Parliament, intituled, An Act for in-4 demnifying all Perfons who have been concerned " in advising or carrying into Execution certain Or-" ders of Council respecting the Importation and Ex-" portation of Corn and Grain, and also certain * Orders islaed by the Governor-General of His " Majesty's Colonies in America, and for preventing " Suits in confequence of the fame, and for mak-" ing further Provisions relative thereto, relating " to the Importation and Exportation of Corn and " Grain, and to authorize His Majesty to permit " the Exportation of Corn, Grain, Meal or Flour, " and to prohibit the Importation thereof on the low " Duties," it was enacted, that at any Time before the 28th Day of February, 1791, it should be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, (among other Things) to prohibit, for a limited Time, the Importation on the low Duties of Foreign Wheat, Wheat-Flour, Rye, Rye-Mcal, Barley, Barley-Meal, Oats; Oat-Meal, Peale and Beans, and in like Manner to recal fuch Prohibition, if Circumflances should appear to to require; and all Perfons acting contrary to fuch Prohibition were

And whereas by an Act passed in the last Section of Parhament, intituled, " An Act to con-" tinue and amend to much of Two Acts, made " in the last Session of Parliament, as relates " to the Importation and Exportation of Corn and " Grain, and to the authorizing His Majefty to permit the Exportation of Corn, Grain, Meal or " Flour, and to prohibit the Importation thereof " on the low Duties,", the faid before recited Act was further continued in Force until the roth Day of June, 1791.

And whereas by virtue of the Powers vefted in His Majesty by the before-mentioned Acts, His Majefty was pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, on the 13th Day of October, 1796; the 5th Day of January, the 18th Day of February, and the 23d Day of March; 1791, to make certain Orders for regulating the Importation of Foreign Wheat, Wheat-Flour, Rye, Rye-Meal, Barley; Barley-Meal, Oats, Oat-Meal, Peale and Beans, which were to continue in Force, by virtue of the fast mentioned Order, unfil the 10th Day of this instant June.

And whereas by another Act, paffed in the last. Seffion of Parliament, intituled, " An Act for re-" gulating the Importation and Exportation of " Corn, and the Payment of the Duty on Foreign " Corn imported, and of the Bounty on Britige . ". Corn exported," it was enacted, That fo much of the
