P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty-fifth Day of March last, to promise and declare, that a Bounty of Three Pounds should be paid to every Able Seaman, and of Two Pounds to every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, fit for His Majesty's Service, and a Bounty of Twenty Shillings to all such Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Thirty-first Day of May then next, voluntarily enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majesty's Ships, or Officers employed in Tenders, or at Rendezvous on Shore for raising Men for the Service of His Majesty's Navy. And whereas His Majesty was also pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixth Day of April last, to promise and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman should be paid in the Manner thereby directed to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal themselves, so that such Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service on or before the said Thirty-first Day of May then next, by any of His Ma-

jefty's Sea Officers appointed to raise Men on Shore, or by the Captains and Commanders of any of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels in the Ports or on the Coasts of this Kingdom: And whereas the Time limited by the said Proclamations for the Payment of the said Bounties and Rewards hath been prolonged and extended to the Thirtieth Day of this instant June; and it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service that the said Bounties and Rewards should continue to be paid for some Time longer, His Majesty; with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the said Bounties and Rewards be prolonged and extended from the said Thirtieth Day of this instant June to the Thirty-first Day of July next, inclusive: Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice; and govern themselves accordingly.

*Extract of a Letter from the Governor and Council of Fort St. George, in their Political Department, to the Court of Directors, dated Feb. 16; 1791.*

**W**E have the Satisfaction of informing your Honourable Court, that the Grand Army moved from their Encampment near Pondamalee on the 5th Instant, and Lord Cornwallis was expected to reach Vellore on the 11th. Tippoo, by the latest Intelligence

gence we have received, was at Mountoorpet, near Trinomalay.

Upon the Approach of our Army towards Madras, the Beginning of last Month, the Enemy broke up his Encampment near Tiagar, and appeared suddenly before Permacoil, which being a small Post, with a few Sepoys, was surrendered on Capitulation. Tripitore, a small Fort in the Barranaul, has been also retaken from us; but these trifling Losses are of no Consequence whatever. The rapid Movement of our Army towards the Mysore Country, and the known Ability of it's Leader, will not only, we hope, speedily restore to us the Blessings of Peace, but effectually curb in future the ambitious Spirit of the Enemy.

*Copy of a Letter from the Governor and Council of Madras, in their Political Department, to the Court of Directors, dated Feb. 17, 1791.*

Honourable-Sirs,

SINCE closing our Dispatch of Yesterday we have received Advices from Earl Cornwallis, dated Vellore, the 13th Instant, stating that, after completing his Battering Train, his Lordship proposed to move the next Day by Chittoor and Moglee, and expected to ascend the Pass, which is distant about Fifty Miles, on the 20th or 21st Instant; that the Head of the Pass is about One Hundred and Ten Miles from Bangalore, to which Place it was his Intention immediately to direct his March, and that he hoped to invest it on the 5th. or 6th of next Month.

The Prince Stadholder and the Princess of Orange are returned to the Hague, and are settled for the Summer at the House in the Wood, after an Absence of near Three Weeks; in the Course of which the Prince and the Hereditary Prince of Orange

(after reviewing the different Bodies of Troops in the Service of the Republic in the Garrisons and upon the Frontiers) made a Visit to the King of Sweden at Aix-la-Chapelle. Prince Ferdinand of Prussia and his Family were also present at that Meeting.

*Paris, June 25.*

The King and Royal Family arrived here this Evening, at Seven o'Clock. They proceeded round the Outside of the Walls of the Town, till they came to the Grille of Chaillot; from whence they passed, in a direct Line, through the Champs Elysees, and the Place de Louis XV. to the Garden of the Thuilleries.
