THEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty-fifth Day of March last, to promise and declare, that a Bounty of Three Pounds should be paid to every Able Seaman, and of Two Pounds to every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, fit for His Maicity's Service, and a Bounty of Twenty Shillings to all such Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Thirty-first Day of May then next, voluntarily enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majesty's Ships, or Officers employed in Tenders, or at Rendezvous on Shore for raising Men for the Service of His Majesty's Navy. And whereas His Majesty was also pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixth Day of April last, to promise and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman should be paid in the Manner thereby directed to any Perfon who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal themfelves, to that such Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service on or before the said Thirty-first Day of May then next, by any of His Ma-

AT the Court at St. James's, the 24th of June, 'jesty's Sea Officers appointed to raise Men on Shore, or by the Captains and Commanders of any of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels in the Ports or on the Coasts of this Kingdom: And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations for the Payment of the faid Bounties and Rewards hath been prolonged and extended to the Thirtieth Day of this instant June; and it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service that the said Bounties and Rewards should continue to be paid for some Time longer, His Majesty; with the Advice of His Priv Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Rewards be prolonged and extended from the faid Thirtieth Day of this instant June to the Thirty-first Day of July next, inclusive : Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice; and govern themfelves accordingly.

The following Advices were this Day received from the East Indies, by the Prince William Henry, one of the Company's Ships:

Extract of a Letter from the Governor and Council of Fort St. George, in their Political Depart-ment, to the Court of Directors, dated Feb. 16; 1791.

WE have the Satisfaction of informing your Honourable Court, that the Grand Army moved from their Encampment near Pondamalee on the 5th Instant, and Lord Cornwallis was expected to reach Vellore on the 11th. Tippoo, by the latest Intelli-

gence we have received, was at Mountoorpet, near Trinomalay.

Upon the Approach of our Army towards Madras, the Beginning of last Month, the Enemy broke up his Encampment near. Tiagar, and appeared fuddenly before Permacoil, which being a finall Post, with a few Sepoys, was furrendered on Capitulation. 'Fripatore, a small Fort in the Barramaul, has been also retaken from us; but these trifling Losses are of no Confequence whatever. The rapid Movement of our Army towards the Myfore Country, and the known Ability of it's Leader, will not only, we hope, speedily restore to us the Bleffings of Peace, but effectually curb in future the ambitious Spirit of the Enemy.

Honourable-Sirs,

SINCE closing our Dispatch of Yesterday we have received Advices from Earl Cornwallis, dated Vellore, the 13th Inflant, stating that, after completing his Battering Train, his Lordship proposed to move the next Day by Chittoor and Moglee, and expected to ascend the Pass, which is distant about Fifty Miles, on the 20th or 21st Instant; that the Head of the Pass is about One Hundred and Ten Miles from Bangalore, to which Place it was his. Intention immediately to direct his March, and that he hoped to invest it on the 5th or 6th of next Month.
