The King has likewise been pleased to appoint the Reverend Doctor Robert Arnott to be Second Master and Professor of Divinity in the New College of St. Andrew, vacant by the Resignation of Doctor George Hill.

To Arthur Lord Harberston, and the Heirs Male of his Body, the Dignity of Viscount Harberston, of Carbery, in the County of Kildare.
