Constantinople, May 22.

The Grand Fleet lies Wind-bound off the Entrance of the Bo phorus, ready to proceed into the Black Sea with the first favourable Change.

The Squadron fitted out for the Protection of the Archipelion, confishing of Two Ships of the Line, Three Frigates, and Five Stoops, departed on the 16th Instant, for the Dardanelles.

Florence, June 28.

On the 24th I flant His Royal Highness the Great Duke made his Public Entry into this City, and receive the Homage of the several Deputies sent on the Occasion, with the usual Ceremonies. The Senate and Magistracy were sworn on the Holy Evangelists, after which the former kissed His Royal Highness's Hand, and the latter his Garment. On the same Day there was a Public Dinner at Court of Sixty Covers, to which the First Officers of the Court, the Foreign Ministers, and Foreigners of Distinction were invited; and at Night the Theatre was illuminated.

Bruffels, July 1.

Yesterday the Ceremony of the Inauguration of the Emperor, as Duke of Brabant, was performed here, when His Royal Highness the Duke of Saxe Teschen took and received, in His Imperial Majesty's Name, the Oaths which are prescribed on this Occasion.

Hague, July 7.

Yesterday Morning about Two o'Clock a Fire broke out in the Admiralty of Amsterdam, and, though every Endeavour was used to extinguish it, confumed, in a few Hours, the Whole of that fine Building, and a large Magazine of Sails, Arms, and other Stores, sufficient, it is said, for the Equipment of Thirteen Ships of War. The Cause of this Misfortune is not yet ascertained.
