Falmouth, Aug. 22.

He 20 inflant came in here the St. Febn of Lubeck, burthen 300 Tuns, laden with Wines and Brandy, bound for Lubeck. The fame day came in the Phenix of Topfham, Thomas Lovey Mafter, bound for Milford,

who fays, that the fame day about y in the afternoon he faw between the *Blackbead* and the *Lizard*, about a League off of the fhore, a Turks man of War of 36 Guns, that the Turks manned out their Boat to come on board him, but the wind freshning at W. N. W. got clear of them.

W. got clear of them. Plymouth: Aug. 23. The z r' inflant came into this Port, Sir Robert Robinson, with a squadron of 10 men of Wat under his command, and failed again the next morning very early. This day the Royal Oak failed with a great many Merchantmen under her Convoy, for the Streights.

Convoy, for the Streights. Naples, Ang. 10. The Spanish men of War are not as yet arrived from Palermo, but hourly expected. In the mean time our Viceroy has hired several yesses to transport the Troops designed for Catalonia and Milan. From Mefina they write, that the Prince he Gonzague, Viceroy of that Kingdom, does wholly apply himself to fettle the affairs there, which had been put out of their course by the late troubles, but that he proceeded with fome severity against those who had quitted their Countrey, and retired with the French, with relation to the Estates they left behind them, which had been all seized, and disposed of to the profit of the King. We are told that we shall have fuddainly a new Viceroy here, the Marquis de los Velez, our present Viceroy, his term being expired.

Venice, Aug. 13. On Sunday laft paffed through this City the Conftable of Colonna, in his way to Milan, where he means to pafs fome time. The Senate hath made choice of Signiora Mocenigo to be their Ambaffador at Conftantinople, From whence we have an account, that the Deputies of the Republick of Ragoufa contiaue not only under a clofe imprifonment, but are very feverely Treated, and even threatened with death, in cafe that State doth not fpeedily pay the fum demanded of them.

Nurenburg, Aug. 19. We have Letters from Bohemia, which fay, that the Rebels in Hungary were grown fo ftrong, as that they had possed themselves of Esperies, a very important place; and the more at this time, for that it pindred the conjunction of the Imperial Forces. The City of Stranburgh hath, made very earnest instances to the Dyot at Ratinforme, for affistance in the danger they are at present in, which however is, it's hoped, not fo great, but that the Imperial Army will be able to fecure them against all the attempts of the French, who are at present possted in their Neighborhood.

Savern, Aug. 23. The French Troops, among other Villages have burnt Schickem, which belongs to the City of Straiburg, and will for the future treat the

Inhabitants and Subjects of it as declared enemics; for those Magistrates have made a Treaty Offensive and Defensive with the Imperialis against France. The Mareschal de Crequi has made three detachments, the first is gone into the Wanzenaw, the second confifting of five fquadrons of Horfe, and two batallions is marched to Blobsheim to cover the Bridge there; and the third, compoled of three thousand men, are come into our neighborhood to guard this paffage; the main of the French Army, remaining encamped. between Brumpt and Hohenfelden, where they conti-nue to burn and destroy all the Countrey round to take away all subsistance from the Imperialists. The great heats, we hear, have cauled fome fickness in the French Army, which is, however faid, to be in a good condition. In the mean time the Duke of Lorrain continues encamped on the other fide the Rhine, between Ralfadt and Stolboffen, having caufed fome Troops' to pais on this fide, under the command of the Generals Schultz and Caprara, who are pofted about Landaw. Two days fince a party of those Troops beat a French Party near the Foreft of Haguenamy and took a great many horles which were at palture. To morrow the Marcichal de Crequi will decamp, and march towards Paffenboven.

Strasburg: Aug 26. Prince Herman of Baden, Geeneral of the Imperial Artillery, continus still here, and is at prefent somewhat indisposed. On Tuesday iast one of our Parties met a French Party near Hausbergen, beat them, took 22 prisoners, and killed a great many. The 24 the French Army decamped from Brumpt, and is we hear, marched towards Pasfenhouren. The Imperial Army moves likewise, in order to their passing the Rbine.

From the İmperial Camp at Swartzach, Aug. 26. The French Army we hear is coming down to Haguenaw, and feems to have defign to attack the body of our Troops, which the Duke of Lorrain cauled to pals the Rhine under command of Gaprara and Schutz, and which being reinforced with 6000 men, that came from the Electorate of Treves, and the Duchy of Linxemburg, is polled between Landaw and Langencandel. This morning our Cavalry began to march towards the Rhine, in order to their paffing it, the Infantry is come to Raflat, and to morrow the Duke of Lorrain will follow with the reft of the Troops. There is a report, as if the French would demolifih Fribourg.

From the Marefchal de Crequi's Camp at Werdty, Aug. 27. The 24 the Marefchal de Crequi, after having taken a review of the Army, decamped from Brumpt, and marched to Paffenbouen, where we continued the next day; yelfenday we marched again, and came hither. The Sieur de Monelar remains with a finall Body of Men between Strasbourg and the Wantzenaw, and the Sieur de Langallerie is pafted with fome Troops at Molfbeim, for the fecurity of our Convoys, which come to us from the Upper Allacer The Imperial Army continues on the other fide the Rbine, between Aaflat and Stolkoffen, where they have beerf joyned
